The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the under-mentioned alteration will, after the 31st December, 1906, be made in the Regulations dated 6th March, 1906, which were published in the London Gazette of the same date, respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Second Class Clerk, Lower Section, for Post Service in the Department of His Majesty's Customs, viz. :—

For Clause 1, which is as follows :—

"1. The limits of age for this situation are 17 and 20, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the examination."

the following clause will be substituted, viz. :—

"1. The limits of age for this situation are 17 and 20. If an examination begins in one of the first six months of any year, candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of March in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of September in that year."

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that an Open Competitive Examination for situations as Male Learner in London in the Department of the Postmaster-General will be held in London, on the 26th July, 1906, under the Regulations dated 12th May, 1905, and published in the London Gazette of the same date.

Appointments will be offered to not fewer than 12 of the Candidates highest on the list, provided they obtain the necessary aggregate of marks and are duly qualified in other respects.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 28th June, an application in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District (Supplemental) :—

WARWICKSHIRE AUDIT DISTRICT.

RUGBY JOINT HOSPITAL DISTRICT.

To Henry Ward Oliver, Barrister-at-Law, District Auditor ;—

To the Rugby Joint Hospital Board ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts ;

And whereas by an Order dated the 12th day of December, 1902, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of Henry Ward Oliver as a District Auditor, and assigned to

him the duties therein mentioned and the District in which he should act as Auditor, and which in the said Order was termed "The Warwickshire Audit District" ;

And whereas the Rugby Joint Hospital Board is an authority whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and it is desirable that the duty of auditing the Accounts of the said Joint Hospital Board and of their Officers be assigned to the said Henry Ward Oliver ;

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise Prescribe, be the duty of the said Henry Ward Oliver to audit the Accounts of the said Joint Hospital Board, and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article II of the above-cited Order ; and that for the purpose of such Audit the area within which the powers, authorities, and jurisdiction of the said Joint Hospital Board may be exercised shall be deemed to be within the said Warwickshire Audit District.

INCLOSURE, &c. EXPENSES ACT, 1868.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, with the approval of the Treasury, propose, in pursuance of the provisions of the above Act, to direct that the fees mentioned below shall be taken in respect of the business transacted by them on or after the twelfth day of July, nineteen hundred and six, in lieu of the fees now authorized for such business.

Redemptions of Rentcharge under the Tithe Acts, 1836 to 1891.

Redemption of a Rentcharge where the apportionment and collection of the consideration money is undertaken by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries :—

Where the Rentcharge does not exceed 6d. per acre	} A fee equal to 12 times the amount of the Rentcharge.
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 6d. but does not exceed 1s. per acre	
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 1s. but does not exceed 2s. per acre	} 10 times.
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 2s. but does not exceed 3s. per acre	
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 3s. but does not exceed 4s. per acre	} 8 times.
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 4s. but does not exceed 6s. per acre	
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 6s. per acre	} 6 times.
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 4s. but does not exceed 6s. per acre	
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 6s. per acre	} 5 times.
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 4s. but does not exceed 6s. per acre	
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 6s. per acre	} 4 times.
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 6s. per acre	
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 6s. per acre	} 3 times.
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 6s. per acre	

The amount of Rentcharge and tithe acreage are, for the purposes of the above fees, to be taken from the apportionment in force.
