WHEREAS, by the Military Manceuvres Act, 1897, it is enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, authorize the execution of Military Manceuvres within specified limits during a specified period not exceeding three months;

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by virtue of the power for this purpose given to His Majesty by the said Act, and of every other power hereunto enabling His Majesty, doth hereby authorize the execution of Military Manœuvres within the limits specified in the Schedule to this Order during the period of one calendar month, commencing from the 1st August, one thousand nine hundred and six.

And the Right Honourable the Principal Secretary of State for the War Department is to give the necessary directions.

THE SCHEDULE.

All that part of the county of Sussex lying within a line drawn from the sea coast at a point south of Brighton Gas Works, thence following the Union Boundary, vià Race Hill over the Brighton—Lewes road and railway north-east of Preston Barracks, to the London—Brighton railway at Preston. Thence northward along the eastern fence of the London—Brighton railway to the northern entrance of Clayton Tunnel, thence along the north sides of the roads from Clayton to Ditchling, Ditchling to Westmeston, and Westmeston through Plumpton to the London—Lewes road at Offham. Thence along the east side of the London—Lewes road by Neville road to Lewes Prison, thence by Winterbourne Hollow to the bridge over the Brighton—Hastings railway near Lewes Waterworks. Thence eastward along the south fence of the Brighton—Hastings railway past Southerham Junction to the eastern boundary of Arlington parish. Thence southwards along the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Arlington, Lullington, Litlington and West Dean to the sea.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the power in Him vested by the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 as amended by the Municipal Corporations Act 1893 to fix the number of wards into which the borough of Henley-upon-Thames shall be henceforth divided and to order and direct that the number of the said wards shall be two which Order was made on the eleventh day of December one thousand nine hundred and five. And whereas on the twentyseventh day of the said month of December one thousand nine hundred and five, the Right Honourable Herbert John Gladstone one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State did under his hand and seal duly appoint me Edward Thornton Hill Lawes, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law to be a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the wards of the said borough.

Now I the said Edward Thornton Hill Lawes

Now I the said Edward Thornton Hill Lawes in pursuance of the power given me by virtue of the said appointment under the said Acts do hereby determine as hereinafter mentioned the boundaries of the said two wards into which the said borough is divided, which wards are hereinafter named and numbered as follows that is to say:—

No. 1.—Henley North Ward. No. 2.—Henley South Ward.

No. 1.-Henley North Ward.

I do hereby determine that Henley North Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough of Henley-upon-Thames as is contained within a line commencing at a point on the municipal borough boundary in the centre of the River Thames opposite the north-east corner of Phyllis Court and running thence in a southerly direction along the said municipal borough boundary in the centre of the River Thames to a point opposite Friday-street, thence in a straight line in a westerly direction to and along the centre of Friday-street intersecting Duke-street and along the centre of Greys-road and along the centre of Greys Hill in a south-westerly direction till it meets the said municipal borough boundary on Greys Hill, continuing thence along the said boundary to the point where the said boundary turns to the north across Coldharbour Farm and thence following the said boundary to the point where it meets the lane leading past Tilebarn Farm to Paradise-road thence in a north-easterly direction following the eastern side of the said lane to a point immediately to the north-east of Rotherfield Court Lodge thence across the said lane and thence in a westerly direction to the north of Rotherfield Court Lodge and following the said municipal borough boundary to the point in Pack and Prime-lane opposite Windmill Cottage, thence in a north-easterly direction along the east side of Pack and Prime-lane to where the same meets Badgemore Hill, thence in a north-westerly direction along the southern side of Badgemore Hill to a point immediately to the east of the centre lodge in Friar Park, thence in a northerly direction still following the municipal borough boundary across Friar Park to and along the western boundary fence of Grenville Lodge and Nutfield and including two cottages on the north-western side thereof to the north-west corner of the garden of such cottages and thence crossing the Fair Mile to the northeast corner of Oxford-place, thence along the northern boundary wall of Oxford-place and Mountfield Villas past the Old White Horse following the municipal borough boundary to a point on the west side of the road leading from Henley to Marlow opposite the northern boundary fence of Phyllis Court, thence across the said roud in a straight line to and along the said northern boundary fence of Phyllis Court to the point of commencement in the River Thames aforesaid.

No. 2. - Henley South Ward.

And I do hereby determine that Henley South Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough of Henley-upon-Thames as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point in the centre of the River Thames, on the municipal borough boundary opposite Friday-street, and running thence in a south-easterly direction along the said municipal borough boundary in the centre of the River Thames to a point in the said river
