Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to inquire into and report on certain questions relating to the health and safety of miners, and the administration of the Mines Acts, namely:—

Whether it is desirable to make compulsory the watering of the roads in dry and dusty mines.

Whether it is desirable to prescribe the forms of safety lamp which may be used in mines, or to prohibit any of those now in use.

What steps could be taken for the better prevention of accidents, particularly those from the use and firing of explosives, from falls of roof and side, from underground haulage, and from winding; whether any special provision should be made to facilitate the work of rescue in the event of an accident; and whether any improvement can be made in the present system of investigation and inquiry into accidents.

Whether any steps should be taken to lay down a standard of ventilation in mines.

What steps should be taken to guard against the disease known as Ankylostomiasis.

Whether the present system of special rules is adequate, and whether the method of establishing such rules could not be made simpler and more effective.

Whether any and if so what, steps should be

taken to improve the administration of the Mines Acts and the discipline in Mines.

Whether any change is desirable in the present system of examination for Managers' and Under Managers' Certificates of Competency, whether the Managers of Metalliferous Mines should be compelled to hold such certificates, and whether certificates granted by Colonial Governments should not be accepted in this country :

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid :

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment :

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant of Excise in the Department of Inland Revenue. (Supplementary to the General Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for situations in the Civil Service included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of 4th June, 1870.)

N.B.—*These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.*

1. *The limits of age for this situation are 19 and 22. If an examination begins in one of the first six months of any year, candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of May in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of November in that year.*

2. Candidates must be unmarried and without family.

3. No person who has been previously successful in an Examination for the situation of Assistant of Excise and has passed into actual employment in that capacity will be eligible to compete.

4. The Examination will be in the following subjects*, viz. :—

1. Handwriting	400
2. English Composition, including Orthography	600
3. Arithmetic (to Vulgar and Decimal Fractions)	400
4. Higher Arithmetic, including Mensuration, Square and Cube Root, &c.	400
5. Geography (general)	400

No subjects are obligatory, but no Candidate will be regarded as qualified who fails to obtain such an aggregate number of marks as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a competent amount of general proficiency.

5. Service marks for each full period of three calendar months of actual approved service, subject to a maximum of twelve of such periods, may be allowed to candidates attending an Examination who are serving or have served as Registered Boy Clerks or Boy Copyists.

6. A fee of £1 will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination.

7. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

8. Each Examination will have reference to such number of vacancies as may be specified in any notice of such Examination published, with the approval of the Lords of the Treasury, in the London Gazette.
