Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in

part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 23rd day of March, 1901, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of Arthur Carson Roberts as a District Auditor, and assigned to him the duties therein mentioned and the District in which he should act as Auditor, which District in the said Order was termed "The Metropolitan Boroughs Audit District'

And whereas by Article VI of the Organisation (Unemployed Workmen) Establishment Order, 1905, a Central Body was established for the Administrative County of London, and it was provided that the said Central Body should be a body corporate by the name of "The Central (Unemployed) Body for London" (hereinafter referred to as "The Central Body");

And whereas by Article XVI of the Regulations (Organisation for Unemployed), 1905, it is provided that the Accounts of a Central Body and of the officers of the Central Body shall be made up and audited in like manner and subject to the same provisions as the accounts of a County Council, and that the enactments relating to the Audit of the Accounts of a County Council, and to all matters incidental thereto and consequential thereon, including the penal provisions, shall apply accordingly;

And whereas by sub-section 3 of Section 71 of the Local Government Act, 1888, it is provided that the accounts of a County Council, and of the officers of such Council, shall be audited by the district auditors appointed by Us, in like manner as accounts of an urban authority and their officers, under Sections 247 and 250 of the Public

Health Act, 1875;

And whereas it is desirable that the duty of auditing the accounts of the Central Body and of their Officers should be assigned to the said

Arthur Carson Roberts;

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall be the duty of the said Arthur Carson Roberts to audit, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article II of the said Order, dated the twentythird day of March, one thousand nine hundred and one, the Accounts of the Central Body and of their Officers; and that for the purpose of the Audit of the said Accounts the area within which the powers, authorities, and jurisdiction of the said Central Body may be exercised shall be deemed to be within the said Metropolitan Boroughs Audit District.

INCOME TAX.

Whereas the Acts of Parliament relating to the Income Tax provide that all persons entrusted with the payment of annuities, or any dividends or shares of annuities payable out of the revenue of any colony or settlement belonging to the Crown of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or out of the revenue of any foreign State; annuities, pensions, or other annual sums payable out of the funds of any Institution in India; or any interest, dividends, or other annual payment, out of or in respect of the stocks, funds, or shares of any foreign or colonial company, society, adventure, or concern, to any persons, corporations, companies, or societies in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or acting therein as agents, or in any other character, shall, without further notice or demand thereof, deliver or cause to be delivered into the Head Office for Inland Revenue, an account, in writing, containing their names and residences, and a description of the annuities, pensions, or other annual sums, dividends, shares, or interest entrusted to them for payment, within one calendar month after the same shall have been required by public notice in the London Gazette, in order that an assessment may be made thereon, at the rate of duty prescribed by an Act of the present session of Parliament (6 Edw. VII, c. 8), His Majesty's Commissioners of Inland Revenue do hereby give notice to all persons entrusted with the payment of any such annuities, pensions, or other annual sums, dividends, shares of annuities, or interest as aforesaid, that the accounts of the said annuities, &c., required by the said Acts, are to be delivered, in writing, into the Head Office for Inland Revenue at Somerset House, in the county of Middlesex, addressed to the Secretary of the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, within the space of one calendar month from the date hereof; and that any person who shall neglect or refuse to deliver such account, is, by the said Acts, made subject to the forfeiture of one hundred pounds, over and above the duty chargeable on such annuities, shares, dividends, or interest.
