The following Address was presented to The King on His Majesty's arrival at Derby, on Thursday, the 28th June, on a visit to the Royal Agricultural Show:—

To His Most Excellent Majesty Edward VII, King of Great Britain and Ireland.

May it please Your Majesty,

We Your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Derby, acting by the Council, humbly desire to offer to Your Majesty a respectful welcome to our town.

In the course of many centuries from time to time the privilege has been accorded to the Corporation of this ancient borough of testifying loyalty to the Sovereigns of this Realm, and we value this opportunity of renewing our sentiments of devotion to Your Majesty's person.

By Your Royal Presence here to-day Your Majesty has added one more to those incalculable services which Your Majesty has rendered to this land.

The many subjects of Your Majesty who are engaged in agriculture cannot but be stimulated and encouraged by Your Majesty's active and unvarying interest in that greatest and most important industry, and evidenced on this occasion by Your attendance at the Annual Show of the Royal Agricultural Society, which so happily possesses in Your Majesty its most distinguished Patron.

We recall with feelings of lively satisfaction the several occasions on which Your Majesty has previously honoured us by Your Royal Presence, and we desire to express our humble gratitude that the purpose of the first visit to this borough since Your Majesty's accession to the throne is the promotion of the public weal.

The great interest and warm sympathy Your Majesty has always given to agriculture has done much to stimulate good farming and to encourage the raising of stock of the highest quality, and we pray that it may please Almighty God to spare Your Majesty long to reign over us, and continue to animate us all by the noble

example of Your own life.

"I heartily thank you for the address which you have handed Me on behalf of the Derbyshire Agricultural and Horticultural Society, and for

"I commenced very early in life to take a warm interest in all matters connected with agriculture, and I have long appreciated the difficulties with which farmers are forced to contend in order to carry on their industry. The cultivation of the land is a factor of the highest importance in the prosperity of the country, and much credit is due to agricultural societies for their strenuous efforts to promote the welfare of the cause they have at heart by encouraging new processes of cultivation and disseminating

information of utility to farmers.

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these Presents authorize and appoint you, the said Ivor Churchill Guest (Chairman); Sir William Hovell Browne ffolkes; Sir Leonard Lyell; William Matthews; William Phipson Beale; George Charles Frederick; Henry Rider George Haggard; Thomas John Jehu; Arthur Levy Robert Beattie Nicholson; Patrick O'Brien; Thomas Summerbell; and Arthur Stanley Wilson, to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry:

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever :

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid:

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

VILEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for Eugland have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the fourteenth day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, in the

words following, that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Eastleigh, in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the twelfth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and published in the London Gazette on the fifteenth day of the same month, a certain part of the parish of South Stoneham, in the said county of Southampton, and in the said diocese of Winchester, was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of the Resurrection, situate at Eastleigh, in the said parish of South Stoneham, and the said district chapelry was named The District Chapelry of Eastleigh."

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Eastleigh, has, under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late. Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Eastleigh shall be altered in the manner which is herein-

after mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Eastleigh shall be altered so that all that portion of the parish of North Stoneham, in the said county of Southampton, and in the said diocese of Winchester, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan bereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Eastleigh.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of

Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the new parish of Eastleigh, in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester, being:—

and in the diocese of Winchester, being:

"All that portion of the parish of North Stoneham, in the said county and diocese, which is bounded upon the north by the said new parish of Eastleigh, upon the east partly by the last named new parish and partly by the parish of South Stoneham, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east, upon the south, upon the south-west, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of South Stoneham from the said parish of North Stoneham at the centre of the bridge which carries the Gosport and Stokes Bay line of the London and South-Western Railway across the River Itchen, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across the old course of the canal known as the Itchen Navigation, and extending thence generally south-westward along the middle of the old course of the said canal (thereby passing Lock House) for a distance of fifty chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the roadway leading from Lock House past North Stoneham Farm into Wide-lane, across the old

course of the said canal, and extending thence first north-westward, then south-westward, then southward and then again north-westward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of forty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wide-lane and the road called Doncaster Drove, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the footpath leading from the junction of Wide-lane and Doncaster Drove into Stoneham-lane for a distance of thirty-nine chains or thereabouts to the junction of the said footpath with Stoneham-lane, and extending thence westward along the middle of Stonehamlane for a distance of nineteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Northendlane, and extending thence northward along the middle of Northend-lane for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-western corner of the new parish of Eastleigh, and extending thence eastward in a straight line across Northend-lane to the boundary which divides the said parish of North Stoneham from the said new parish of Eastleigh."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the two cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and the Patron and Incumbent of the said new parish of Eastleigh have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the Patron and Incumbent of the said parish of North Stoneham have offered certain objections to the said scheme or representation.

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since the transmission of the said notices.

And whereas, notwithstanding the said objections, the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourteenth day of June, in the year one

thousand nine hundred and six, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district or new parish for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the parish of Farnborough, in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said parish of Farnborough is a parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of Farnborough which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district or new parish in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is within the limits of the said proposed separate district or new parish a consecrated church in use for the purpose of Divine worship and such church is named 'The Church of Saint Mark, South Farnborough.'

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of four thousand three hundred pounds sterling towards providing an endowment for the said proposed district or new parish, and we have in respect of the said sum of four thousand three hundred pounds sterling agreed and have undertaken to pay by equal quarterly payments on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August and the first day of November in each and every year to the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed district or new parish and to his successors a sum of one hundred and twentynine pounds per annum as long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands.

"And whereas the said capital sum of four thousand three hundred pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a capital sum of seven hundred pounds sterling in respect of which there should be paid by us to the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed district or new parish and to his successors a yearly sum of twenty-one pounds, and upon the further understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage to the said proposed district or new parish should be assigned in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said grant of seven hundred pounds sterling will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.

"And whereas the contributors of part of the said sum of four thousand three hundred pounds have nominated the Bishop of Winchester for the time being as the person in whom they desire that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish shall be vested.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Farnborough which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district or new parish for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The New Parish of Saint Mark, South Farnborough.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the said church of Saint Mark, South Farnborough, shall as from the day last mentioned be and for that purpose we hereby specify the same church as the parish church of the said new parish of Saint Mark, South Farnborough.

"And we further recommend and propose with the consent of the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester (testified as aforesaid) that without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish that is to say of the new parish of Saint Mark, South Farnborough aforesaid, and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto shall be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing scheme has reference.

"The New Parish of Saint Mark, South Farnborough, being:-

"All that part of the parish of Farnborough in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester, which is bounded upon the east partly by the new parish of Frimley and partly by the parish of Ash, both in the county of Surrey and in the said diocese of Winchester, upon the south by the parish of Aldershot, and upon the west by the particular district or new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Cove, both in the said county of Southampton and in the said diocese of Winchester, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said particular district or new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Cove, from the said parish of Farnborough at the northwestern corner of Farnborough Common and extending thence eastward along the fence forming the northern boundary of Farnborough Common for a distance of thirty-four chains or thereabouts to the point at the north-eastern

corner of Farnborough Common where such fence meets the fence extending in the same direction and forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises known as Willoughby Villas, and extending thence eastward along the last mentioned boundary fence for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of the high road leading from Farnham to Farnborough and extending thence first eastward to and then northward along the middle of the said high road for a distance of fourteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Sycamore-road and extending thence first north-eastward then eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of Sycamore-road for a distance of forty-four chains and a half or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the private road leading to Avenue Farm and extending thence in a straight line due east for a distance of fifteen chains and a half or thereabouts (thereby crossing the Reading line of the South-Eastern and Chatham Railway) to a point in the middle of Blackwater River upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Farnborough from the said new parish of Frimley."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the Incumbent of the parish out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council has been made directing the discontinuance of burials.

with certain exceptions, in the parish churchyard of Saint Martin, North Nibley, in the county of Gloucester, from the time specified in such Order:

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyard be postponed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the time appointed for the discontinuance of burials in the parish church-yard of Saint Martin, North Nibley, in the county of Gloucester, be postponed to the thirtieth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and six.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it was enacted that, in case it appeared to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits; save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground should be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case : might require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances might require; provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it should please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, should be published in the London . Gazette, and should be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation was so considered; provided also that no such representation should be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation should have been given . to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or . churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of the parish of Saint Peter, Needham, in the county of Norfolk, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation, made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial ground should be opened in the civil parish of Needham; without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials

should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

As the cautionary notices respecting fogsignals given in the introductory notes in all copies of the Admiralty List of Lights, do not appear to be quite understood, more especially the paragraphs pointing out that such signals are heard at greatly varying distances, and that there are occasionally areas around a fog-signal station in which the fog-signal is wholly inaudible, it is thought desirable to point out to scamen that not infrequently a fog signal, which may be heard under favourable circumstances from a distance of 10 miles or upwards, is inaudible when only 2 or 3 miles off it, and that no surprise should be felt if, from a vessel either at anchor or under way, not far from a fog-signal station, the sound of the fog-signal is not heard on board.
