

the time being as the person in whom they desire that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish shall be vested.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Farnborough which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district or new parish for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The New Parish of Saint Mark, South Farnborough.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the said church of Saint Mark, South Farnborough, shall as from the day last mentioned be and for that purpose we hereby specify the same church as the parish church of the said new parish of Saint Mark, South Farnborough.

"And we further recommend and propose with the consent of the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester (testified as aforesaid) that without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish that is to say of the new parish of Saint Mark, South Farnborough aforesaid, and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto shall be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing scheme has reference.

"The New Parish of Saint Mark, South Farnborough, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Farnborough in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester, which is bounded upon the east partly by the new parish of Frimley and partly by the parish of Ash, both in the county of Surrey and in the said diocese of Winchester, upon the south by the parish of Aldershot, and upon the west by the particular district or new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Cove, both in the said county of Southampton and in the said diocese of Winchester, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said particular district or new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Cove, from the said parish of Farnborough at the north-western corner of Farnborough Common and extending thence eastward along the fence forming the northern boundary of Farnborough Common for a distance of thirty-four chains or thereabouts to the point at the north-eastern

corner of Farnborough Common where such fence meets the fence extending in the same direction and forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises known as Willoughby Villas, and extending thence eastward along the last mentioned boundary fence for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of the high road leading from Farnham to Farnborough and extending thence first eastward to and then northward along the middle of the said high road for a distance of fourteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Sycamore-road and extending thence first north-eastward then eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of Sycamore-road for a distance of forty-four chains and a half or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the private road leading to Avenue Farm and extending thence in a straight line due east for a distance of fifteen chains and a half or thereabouts (thereby crossing the Reading line of the South-Eastern and Chatham Railway) to a point in the middle of Blackwater River upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Farnborough from the said new parish of Frimley."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the Incumbent of the parish out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.
