copy of a Despatch, dated July 2, from His Majesty's Representative at The Hague intimating that, in consequence of several cases of Meningitis Cerebrospinalis Epidemica having occurred in the Netherlands and of the prevalence of this disease abroad, the laws providing against infectious diseases of December 4, 1872, and that for preventing the introduction of infectious diseases by vessels arriving from sea of March 28, 1877, have been made applicable to "Meningitis Cerebrospinalis Epidemica" for a period of one year. The diseases to which the above named laws have been applicable up to the present are Plague, Asiatic Cholera, and Yellow Fever. The provisions of the Royal Decree came into force on July 2.

LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

The Board of Trade have recently confirmed the following Order made by the Light Railway Commissioners:—Canterbury and Herne Bay Light Railway (Extension of Time) Order, 1906, reviving the powers granted and extending the period limited by the Canterbury and Herne Bay Light Railway Order, 1908, for the compulsory purchase of lands and extending the period limited by that Order for the completion of the railway and works by that Order authorized.
