

BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

Fees to be taken in respect of Transactions under the Tithe Acts, 1836 to 1891, in accordance with the provisions of the Inclosure, &c., Expenses Act, 1868 (31 and 32 Vict., c. 89), in lieu of the fees heretofore authorized for such business.

Redemptions of Rentcharge under the Tithe Acts, 1836 to 1891.

Redemption of a Rentcharge where the apportionment and collection of the consideration money is undertaken by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:—

Where the Rentcharge does not exceed 6d. per acre	}	A fee equal to 12 times the amount of the Rentcharge.
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 6d. but does not exceed 1s. per acre		10 times.
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 1s. but does not exceed 2s. per acre	}	8 times.
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 2s. but does not exceed 3s. per acre		6 times.
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 3s. but does not exceed 4s. per acre	}	5 times.
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 4s. but does not exceed 6s. per acre		4 times.
Where the Rentcharge exceeds 6s. per acre	}	3 times.

The amount of Rentcharge and tithe acreage are, for the purposes of the above fees, to be taken from the apportionment in force.

The above fees are to be taken in respect of the business transacted by the Board on or after the twelfth day of July, nineteen hundred and six.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 26TH JULY 1906.)

PETERSFIELD (MARKETS AND SALES) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them

in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Regulation of Exposure of Animals for sale within the Urban District of Petersfield.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order—

- (i.) No market or sale of animals shall be held in or upon any market-place, highway, sale-yard or other premises in the urban district of Petersfield, in the administrative county of Southampton, until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date on which the premises were previously so used unless the premises, or a part thereof sufficient to accommodate the number of animals usually exposed at such market or sale, are so paved with cement, concrete, asphalt, or other hard material impervious to water, as to permit of the same being effectually cleansed by washing; and
- (ii.) No animal shall be exposed for sale in or upon any part of a street or highway in the urban district of Petersfield unless such part of the street or highway is so paved with cement, concrete, asphalt, or other hard material impervious to water, as to permit of the same being effectually cleansed by washing.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3. If any animal is exposed for sale, or any market or sale of animals is held, in contravention of this Order, the person exposing the animal or holding the market or sale, and the owner or consignee of each animal exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the purchaser thereat of any animal, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market or sale to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

4. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

- “Animals” means cattle, sheep, and goats, and all other ruminating animals, and swine;
- “Person” includes any body of persons corporate or unincorporate;
- “The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894;
- Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and seven.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the PETERSFIELD (MARKETS AND SALES) ORDER OF 1906.
