Voslapp—Lighthouse Constructing.

The German Government has given notice, dated 11th August, 1906, that an occulting light every eight seconds, thus:—Light, four seconds; eclipse, four seconds, has been established on a light beacon, painted black, erected on Sengwarder Balje, in the approach to Wilhelmshaven; it is elevated 22 feet above high water, and shows the following sectors:—White from the bearing of N. 11° E., through east, to S. 29° E., red from S. 29° E., through south, to S. 52° W., white from S. 52° W., through west, to N. 34° W., red from N. 34° W., through north, to N. 11° E., the white and red lights being visible from distances of 8 and 6 miles respectively.
