ORDER of the Local Government Board: Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulations under Section 9 (1).

: BOROUGH OF HARROGATE.

: To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Harrogate;—

: And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made

by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the Local Authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the Town Council of the Borough of Harrogate having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned sub-section putting the provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads and parts of roads situate within the Borough of Harrogate (hereinafter referred to as "the Borough"), We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and an Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads and parts of roads within the Borough which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and six.

SCHEDULE.

So much of Cornwall-road as extends from its junction with West Park to the Grand Hotel; Crown-place; Crescent-road; Montpellier-road; so much of Ripon-road as extends in a southerly direction from its junction with Swan-road; Parliament-street; so much of West Park as extends in a northerly direction from its junction with Cornwall-road; Royal-parade; Swan-road; Victoria Bath-road; so much of York-road as extends from its junction with Clarence-drive to its junction with Swan-road.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 25TH SEPTEMBER 1906.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or of any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved to the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and from such exhibition to any place of destination in Great Britain situate in any

scheduled area, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement.

2. In the case of movement to the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by some person authorised in that behalf by the Newport Borough Council, and in the case of movement from the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

3. The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the exhibition or place of destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere, and while being so moved shall not be subject to Regulations made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever.

No. 1075.—AFRICA, EAST COAST—PUNGUE RIVER.

Beira Harbour—Entrance Channel Changed; Alterations in Buoyage.

The Portuguese Government has given notice, dated 1st August, 1906, that amendments to the buoyage have been made, and that a new channel, now called the South-east Channel, has opened to the southward of the present channel into Pungue River, and that this channel has been buoyed from the entrance to its junction with the other channel to Beira, as follows:—

1. Buoys established:—

SOUTH-EAST CHANNEL.—*a.* A spherical fairway or pilot-station buoy, painted in black and white horizontal bands, surmounted by a white staff, moored in a depth of 36 feet, at a distance of 10 miles, S. 13° E., from Macuti Lighthouse.

b. A black can buoy, surmounted by a cylindrical topmark and marked "1," moored in a depth of 21 feet at a distance of $8\frac{1}{16}$ miles, S. 4° E., from Macuti Lighthouse.

c. A red spherical buoy, marked "2," moored in a depth of 17 feet at a distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles, S. 2° E., from Macuti Lighthouse.

d. A red conical buoy, marked "4," moored in a depth of 22 feet, at a distance of $6\frac{1}{16}$ miles, S. 6° W., from Macuti Lighthouse.

RAMBLER CHANNEL.—*e.* A black buoy, marked "3," moored in a depth of 28 feet, at a distance of $6\frac{1}{16}$ miles, S. 30° W., from Macuti Lighthouse.

f. A red buoy, marked "6," moored in a depth of 26 feet, at a distance of $5\frac{1}{16}$ miles, S. 27° W., from Macuti Lighthouse.

Approximate position, Macuti Lighthouse, lat. 19° 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' S., long. 34° 58 $\frac{3}{4}$ ' E.

2. Buoys re-lettered or re-numbered:—

ENTRANCE CHANNEL.—Nos. 1, 2 and 3 buoys, in the present or northern entrance channel have been re-marked "A," "B," and "C," respectively.

RAMBLER CHANNEL.—The buoys marked "B," "C," "D," in Rambler Channel have been re-marked "8," "10," "12," respectively.

Those marked "E" and "F" have been re-marked "5" and "7."

Nos. 10 and 11 buoys in Beira Harbour have been re-numbered "11" and "13," respectively.

3. Buoys withdrawn:—

a. The black buoy, marked "A," at the entrance to Rambler Channel.

b. The black buoys, Nos. 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8, in the Old Channel, westward of Rambler Channel, also the two buoys with topmarks, on the western side of the same channel.

4. Depths:—

The south-east channel has at present a least depth of 14 feet at low water over a muddy bottom.

The banks southward of the present entrance are extending to the south-eastward. A depth of 16 feet exists at a distance of 2 miles to the southward of the outer black buoy (A) of that channel, thence it gradually increases to the eastward to a depth of 4 fathoms on the bank now shown on the chart.

NOTE.—The channels are subject to constant change, and a stranger should either take a pilot, or carefully examine the channel before entering.

Red buoys with even numbers mark the star-board side of the channel when entering from seaward, and black buoys with odd numbers the port side.

After the 1st November, 1906, the pilot vessel will be found cruising off the entrance to the south-east channel.

Bonavista—Reef Westward of.

Ha Long Bay—Shoals in Approach.

Cape João Diaz—Light Discontinued.

The Brazilian Government has given notice that, on the 20th August, 1906, a white flashing light every twenty seconds, elevated 269 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 20 miles, would be exhibited from a white square masonry tower, 49 feet in height, erected on the summit of Paz Island, the largest of the Graça Islands, in the approach to the River São Francisco do Sul.
