ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 11TH OCTOBER 1906.)

LINCOLNSHIRE (PARTS OF HOLLAND)
(SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Order.

1. The "scheduled area" for the purposes of this Order means the administrative county of the Parts of Holland Division of Lincolnshire.

Regulation of Movement of Swine from Markets and Saleyards.

2.—(1.) The movement of swine from any market or saleyard in the scheduled area shall be subject to the following provisions.

(2.) If the market or saleyard is specially authorised by the Local Authority under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, the movement of the swine exposed at the market or saleyard shall be subject to the provisions of the Order under which the market or saleyard is so authorised.

(3.) In the case of any other market or saleyard, the movement of the swine exposed thereat shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(i.) The swine shall be accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market or saleyard is situate. The licence shall state the name and address of the person who moved the swine into the market or saleyard, and the number and description of the swine to be moved, and shall contain a description of the market or saleyard from which, and of the premises to which, the swine are to be moved.

(ii.) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere and shall be there detained and isolated from other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period.

(iii.) A copy of a licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination specified in the licence.

Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

3.—(1.) An exhibition of swine may be held in the scheduled area with a licence of the Local Authority, on such conditions, if any, as they think expedient, and not otherwise.

(2.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, by such licence authorise the sale at such exhibition of the swine exhibited thereat on such conditions, if any, as they think expedient.

(3.) The Local Authority shall not grant a licence for an exhibition under this Article unless they are satisfied that the proposed exhibition is a bonâ fide agricultural show, and that the swine are to be exhibited thereat for competition.

Restriction on Movement out of Scheduled Area.

4. Swine shall not be moved from the scheduled area to any place outside the scheduled area, except in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.

General Provision for Movement with Licence.

5.—(1.) The restriction on movement imposed by the preceding Article shall not apply to swine if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration, countersigned as hereinafter provided, to the effect:

(i.) That he is the owner of [or the agent authorised in writing for this purpose by the owner of] the swine;

(ii.) That the swine have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the date of the declaration;

(iii.) That to the best of his knowledge and belief the swine are not affected with swine-fever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever; and

(iv.) That the swine are not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and that the movement of the swine is not prohibited by notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(3.) The declaration as to swine to be moved shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the District where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(5.) The licence shall be in force for six days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the licence is granted, the number
