

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 31ST OCTOBER 1906.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Regulation of Movement from Birmingham
Exhibition*

1.—(1.) Swine exposed at the Exhibition intended to be held by the Birmingham Agricultural Society in Bingley Hall, Birmingham, on the 1st to 6th days (inclusive) of December, 1906, may be moved out of the city of Birmingham if they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Corporation of Birmingham, which licence is hereby authorised to be granted.

(2.) For the movement of such swine with a licence granted under this Order into a Scheduled Area subject to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, with or without modifications thereof, a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate, shall also be required and may be granted under this Order.

(3.) A licence granted under this Order shall not exempt the swine moved therewith from any restriction on movement of swine imposed by regulations made by the Local Authority of any District.

(4.) Swine moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

(5.) This Order shall not be construed as prohibiting any movement which is authorised under Article 2 of the Birmingham (Swine - Fever) Order of 1906.

Offences.

2. If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 1ST NOVEMBER 1906.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of
Movement) Order of 1903.*

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 shall apply to the Area described in the Schedule hereto.

*Provision for Movement through Scheduled Area
by Road.*

2. Swine shall not be deemed to be moved into the Area described in the Schedule hereto in any case where they are moved through the Area in a float van or cart from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area in accordance with the following conditions:—

(1.) The swine must be accompanied by a licence authorising the movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of each District within the Area through which they are to be moved; and

(2.) the swine must not within the Area be removed from the float van or cart, or be permitted to come in contact with other swine.

(3.) The swine must be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

Provision as to Local Regulations.

3. The powers of the Local Authorities of any District comprised in the Area described in the Schedule hereto to make regulations under the Swine-Fever Order of 1894, as to movement, exposure, or sale of swine, shall be suspended during the operation of this Order, and all such regulations in force at the commencement of this Order shall thereupon cease to operate.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and six.
