No. 1267.—CANADA, GULF OF ST. LAW-RENCE—ANTICOSTI ISLAND.

Ellis Bay—Leading Lights Established; Pier Constructed.

The Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, dated 27th September, 1906, that the proprietor of Anticosti Island has established two leading lights in Ellis Bay, as follows:—

a. A front light, white fixed, elevated 35 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 11 miles from the bearing of N. 26° W., through north, to N. 64° E., shown from an iron cylindrical tower, 33 feet high, on a concrete base, painted white, the lantern roof being red, erected on the head of a new pier in a position situated at a distance of $5\frac{1}{2}$ cables S. 12° W. from Gamache Pier Head.

Approximate position, lat. 49° $48\frac{1}{2}$ ′ N., long. 64° 22′ W.

b. A rear light, white fixed, elevated 79 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 14 miles from the bearing of N. 53° W., through north, to N. 37° E.; it is shown from an iron cylindrical tower, 52 feet high, on a masonry base, painted white, the lantern roof being red, erected on the point at the head of the bay, and situated on Chart No. 308, at a distance of $6\frac{7}{10}$ cables N. 10° E. from the front light.

The above lights, which are dioptric of the 4th order, in line N. 10° E. lead into the bay. As these lights are for private purposes they may be considered unreliable.

The new pier extends from the position of the front light in a N. 77° E. direction to the coast, which is reported to have altered slightly since it was last surveyed nearly 80 years ago.
