To prescribe the manner in which all or any of the powers of the Order may be exercised by the Company or to provide that such powers or some of them may be exercised by the Directors of the Company.

To vary or extinguish any existing rights or privileges which might interfere with or prevent the execution of the objects and purposes of the Order and to confer all such powers, rights and privileges as may be necessary or convenient for carrying the same into effect.

The Petition and draft Order and printed copies thereof will be deposited at the office of the Secretary for Scotland, Whitehall, London, on the 17th day of December next.

The subsequent procedure in respect of the said application will be by way of Provisional Order, unless it is otherwise decided, in terms of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act, 1899, in which case the procedure may be by way of Private Bill, and this Notice and the deposits in reference to the said application will, subject to the Standing Orders of Parliament, apply to such Bill.

HIPPERHOLME ELECTRIC LIGHTING.

(Amendment of the Hipperholme Electric Lighting Order, 1905, by extending the Time limited by that Order for the execution of Works; Provisions with respect to transfer of Powers.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Urban District Council of Hipperholme in the West Riding of the county of York (hereinafter called "the Council"), whose address is the Council's offices, Hipperholme, intend to apply to the Board of Trade on or before the 21st day of December next for a Provisional Order (hereinafter referred to as "the intended Order") under

the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, for all or some of the following, amongst other, purposes (that it to say):—

1. To amend section 6 of the Hipperholme Electric Lighting Order, 1905, confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1905 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1905"), by extending the period within which distributing mains are to be laid down within the streets named in the third schedule to the said Order.

2. To authorize the Council to transfer, assign or lease all or any of the powers, rights, privileges, duties, liabilities and works of the Council under the Order of 1905 and the intended Order and the Acts incorporated therewith respectively, to any local authority, company or person, and to authorize such local authority, company or person to exercise all or any of such powers on such terms, for such periods and subject to such exceptions and modifications as may be agreed upon or sanctioned by the Order, and to confirm and give effect to any agreement or agreements which may have been or may be made in that behalf.

3. To divest the Council of any legal powers, rights or obligations conferred or imposed upon them by the Order of 1905, and to authorize the Council and any local authority, company or person to make and carry into effect agreements with respect to the production, supply and distribution or purchase in bulk or otherwise of electricity and the performance of all or any of the Acts incidental to the supplying of electricity for all public and private purposes within the area of supply as defined in the Order of 1905 or any part thereof.

4. To make provision with respect to the supply under the Order of 1905 of electrical energy in cases where the consumer has a separate supply and to modify the obligations imposed with respect thereto.

5. To alter, modify or repeal any of the provisions of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, and the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, in such manner and to such extent as may be prescribed by the Order.
