- (i.) In the case of movement from premises outside the Scheduled Area to premises in the Scheduled Area the licence shall be that required by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903.
- (ii.) In the case of movement from any lair market or saleyard in the Scheduled Area specially authorised under the last-mentioned Order, the licence shall be that required by Article 5 of that Order, and the movement shall be subject to the conditions stated in that Article.
- (iii.) In the case of movement from any other market or saleyard, or from any exhibition, in the Scheduled Area, the swine must be accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market saleyard or exhibition is situate. In such case no declaration is required.
- (iv.) In any other case of movement along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in the Scheduled Area, the swine must be accompanied by a Movement Licence authorising such movement (in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are when the Licence is granted. The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue, and shall only be granted on a declaration (in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect), signed by the owner of the swine or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose. Every person to whom application is made for a Licence shall, so far as is practicable, before granting the same, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the declaration, and that the proposed movement is necessary or expedient. The declaration shall be retained by the person granting the Licence and disposed of by him as may be directed by the Local Authority on whose behalf the Licence was granted.
- (2.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

Movement of Swine for Breeding Purposes with Licence.

- 4.—(1.) A Licence under this Order expressly granted for the movement of swine from premises in the Scheduled Area to any premises for breeding purposes shall be available as a Licence under this Order for the movement of the swine by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay back to the premises from which they were moved under the Licence: Provided that such movement shall take place within the four days or less period during which the Licence is available.
- (2.) No Licence shall be granted for movement of swine for breeding purposes to premises in the Scheduled Area from premises not in the Scheduled Area.

Movement from Ireland.

5. This Order does not apply to swine which are being moved under and in accordance with

the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Orders of 1904 and 1906 or either of those Orders.

Regulation of Sales in Scheduled Area.

- 6. No market, fair, sale, or exhibition of swine shall be held in the Scheduled Area unless it is authorised by the Local Authority of the District (which authority the Local Authority are hereby empowered to grant), or unless it is a sale held in accordance with the following conditions:
 - (i.) All the swine exposed at the sale must have been on the premises where the sale is held for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the date of the sale;
 - (ii.) The swine must not be affected with swine-fever or have been exposed to the infection of swine-fever during the said period; and
 - (iii.) The sale must not be held in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and the movement of the swine must not have been prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Straying of Swine on Highways.

7. No pig shall be allowed to stray on a highway or thoroughfare or on the sides thereof in the Scheduled Area.

Construction.

8. Part II of this Order shall be read as one with the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 in its application to the Scheduled Area.

Commencement.

9. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and seven.

Short Title.

10. This Order may be cited as the Wiltshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906.

Area to which this Order applies.

An Area comprising the administrative county of Wilts.
