WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Essex) Order, 1906,

Dated 14th December, 1906.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Essex, I hereby make the following Order:-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Essex) Order, 1906."

Close Time varied.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited within the County of Essex shall be varied, except in regard to the Mallard (Wild Duck), so as to be between the 14th day of March and the 16th day of August in any year.

The close time for the Mallard (Wild Duck) shall be varied so as to be between the last day of February and the 8th day of August in any

III. The provisions of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within so much of the County of Essex as is within the Metropolitan Police District to the following Wild Birds in the same manner as if those Birds were included in the Schedule to the Act:

Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Hen Harrier. Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Osprey, Owl (all species), Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Rededling or Reed Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Phospath), Waynesh (Chalcale Mate or Speke Pheasant), Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 15th day of August in any year and the 15th day of March following, the killing or taking of the Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Merlin, and Owl (all species) is prohibited throughout the County of

Other Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During the period between the 15th day of August in any year and the 15th day of March following the killing or taking of the following kinds of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Essex :-

Common Bunting, Snow Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Coot, Tree Creeper, Cuckoo, Flycatchers, Goldfinch, Hawfinch, Landrail (or Corncrake), Lark Linnet, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Red-start, Shrikes, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, start, Shrikes, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Long-tailed Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Certain Districts exempted from the operation of the foregoing Clause.

VI. I hereby exempt from the portion of this Order numbered V., the whole County of Essex, except the portion lying within the Metropolitan Police District, and except the parishes of Epping, Epping Upland, Theydon Bois, Theydon Garnon, and Lambourne.

All Birds protected on Sundays within a certain Area.

VII. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as varied by Clause II of this Order does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the County of Essex except in the undermentioned Parishes:—

Alphamstone, Ashen, Belchamp Otten, Belchamp St. Paul, Belchamp Walter, Birdbrook, Borley, Bulmer, Bumpstead (Helious), Bumstead (Steeple), Bures Hamlet, Foxearth, Gestingthorpe, Henny (Great), Henny (Little), Lamarsh, Liston, Middleton, Northwood, Ovington, Pentlow, Sturmer, Twinsted, Wickham St. Paul.

· Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected in that part of the County within the Metropolitan Police District.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within so much of the County of Essex as is within the Metropolitan Police District.

Black-headed Buuting, Yellow Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Coot, Cuckoo, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Hawfinch, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Landrail (or Corncrake), Sky Lark, Wood Lark, Linnet, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Wood or Tawny Owl, Redstart, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Starling, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Long-tailed Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Whitethroat, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

All Eggs protected within a certain Area.

IX. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited for a period of five years from the date of this Order within the following area:—

The whole of the foreshore, including the shingle, sand hills, salt marshes, creeks, and other uninclosed lands extending from high-water mark to the first boundary of enclosed or cultivated lands separating the foreshore from them, between the following points on the coast, namely, from Harwich Lighthouse to Shoeburyness; such parts of the tidal river Blackwater as are above the town of Maldon, such parts of the river Colne as are above Wivenhoe, and such parts of the River Crouch as are above Battles Bridge being excepted from the said area.

Repeal of former Order.

The Order of the 18th December, 1901, is hereby repealed.

NORFOLK (LODDON AND DISTRICT) (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1906.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, with modifications, to certain Scheduled District.

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall apply to the District specified in the Schedule hereto, (in this Order referred to as the Scheduled District), as if that District had been declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area, but subject to the modifications hereinafter contained.

Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

2.—(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition of swine in the Scheduled District if they are satisfied that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and thereupon the market fair sale or exhibition may be held accordingly.

(2.) A Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fairs sales or exhibitions on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time or revoked at any time by the Local Authority.

- (3.) A Licence shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same, and a copy of the Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition where such market fair sale or exhibition is held.
- (4.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article.
- (5.) A fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority and named in the Licence for the purpose of receiving Licences authorising movement of swine to the market fair sale or exhibition, and for granting Licences for movement of swine therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
- (6.) No swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare into a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Article unless accompanied by a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order.

Licences for Movement out of Licensed Markets, &c.

- 3.—(1.) Swine exposed at a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order may be moved from the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in a Swine Fever Infected Area or in the Scheduled District if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement—in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the market fair sale or exhibition is held.
- (2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (3.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where the place of destination specified in the Licence is in a Swine-Fever Infected Area, or in the Scheduled District, the swine shall be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

- 4.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to a market fair sale or exhibition in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or in the Scheduled District, the Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition by the person in charge of the swine to the person appointed under this Order to receive the same.
- (2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to any other premises in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or in the Scheduled District, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

Attendance at Markets, &c.

5. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order.

Revocation by Board of Licences.

6. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Forms.

9. For the purposes of any Movement Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order, the Scheduled District shall be deemed to be a Swine Fever Infected

Offences.

- 10.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

- 11. In this Order-
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- . "Swine-Fever Infected Area" means an area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area:
 - "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.



1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the East Suffolk (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906 (No. 5), herein referred to as "the principal Order," shall apply to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, but subject to the conditions of this Order.

Swine to be licensed out of Licensed Markets, &c., only to bacon factory or slaughterhouse.

2.-(1.) Where swine are moved with a licence in pursuance of the principal Order to a market, fair, saleyard, or exhibition licensed under that Order, the swine shall be moved from such premises only if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fair, saleyard, or exhibition is situate and only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence, where the swine after their arrival shall be detained until they are slaughtered.

(2.) A copy of a licence for movement from a market, fair, saleyard, or exhibition, shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the

licence.
