Buckingham Palace, December 11, 1906.

This day had Audience of The King:—
General Doctor Don Emilio Maria Terán, to
present his Credentials as Envoy Extraordinary
and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Republic
of Ecuador;

Señor Don Daniel Muñoz, to present his Credentials as Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Republic of Uruguay; and

Phya Visutr Kosa, to present Phya Raja Nuprabandh's Letter of Recall and his own Credentials as Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from His Majesty the King of Siam.

The KING has been pleased to give and graut unto Kenneth Mackenzie Scott, Esq., M.B., M.Ch., His Majesty's Royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the Insignia of the Fourth Class of the Imperial Ottoman Order of the Osmanieh, conferred upon him by His Highness the Khedive of Egypt, authorized by His Imperial Majesty the Sultan of Turkey, in recognition of his services.

The KING has been pleased to grant unto George Day Harrison, of Radford House, in the parish of Stone, and county of Stafford, Esquire, and Evelyn, his wife, His Royal licence and authority that they may take and use the surnames of Buckworth-Herne-Soame in lieu and instead of that of Harrison, and that he, the said George Day Harrison, may bear the arms of Soame quarterly with those of

Buckworth; the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in the Cellege of Arms.

The KING has been pleased to grant unto Evan Meredyth Thomas, of Clungunford Hall, in the parish of Aston-on-Clun, and county of Salop, Gentleman, His Royal licence and authority that he may take and use the surname of Rocke in lieu and instead of his own surname Thomas, and that he may bear the arms of Rocke; the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in the College of Arms.
