

**Madrid, Aug. 21.** We have an account that two Spanish Men of War, called the *St. Lorenzo* and the *St. Carlos*, sailed lately from *Passage* towards *Cadiz*, and near the *Groyne* were joined by two others, called the *St. Philippe* and the *St. Jan*. Soon after they discovered 4 Sail; and the *St. Jan*, who was nearest to them, bore up to discover what they were, and finding they were French Men of War engaged them, and maintained alone a Fight with them for several Hours, but at last was so disabled in her Masts and Rigging, and the Ship so shattered, that distressed she was either sunk or taken. The other 3, who could not come in to her assistance are since arrived at *Cadiz*, and ordered to proceed up the *Streights* to join the Spanish Armada, which is now on the Coast of *Catalonia*, consisting of 14 Men of War and several light Frigates. They will likewise be joined by the Spanish Gallies, which are 28 in number.

**Vienna, Aug. 28.** The Letters from *Essecke* of the 22d instant tell us, that the whole Army would march that day towards *Peter Waradin*, being composed of 60000 Men, including the Hungarians and Radziens. The Turkish Army has not yet passed the *Sava*, but lies on the other side near *Belgrade*; And the Grand Visier has sent a Detachment to join *Tockley* in *Upper Hungary*. The Tartars that were coming to join the Visier are retired as we hear in some Discontent towards *Budziak*.

**Hydelberg, Sept. 2.** On the 31st past the Landgrave of *Hesse* decamped from *Vainheim*, and having passed the *Neckar* here with 22 pieces of Cannon, joined yesterday near *Mainheim* with the Forces Commanded by the Margrave of *Bareith*, making together about 30000 Men; The Bridge of Boats that was laid over the *Rhine* was finished the same day, and the Landgraves Cavalry passed that River, and the Foot and Baggage follows this day. The French have abandoned *Neustadt*, and are retired beyond *Landau*; It is thought that the Confederates design to attack that place.

**Hamburg, September 2.** We have Advice, That the Tartar Han marching through *Valachia* to join the Grand Visier, there arose on the 21st of *July*, at a place called *Odrowia*, a dispute between him and the principal Men of the Tartars, which was occasioned by some old Disputes, and proceeded now to that height, that they all abandoned the Tartar Han, and returned towards *Budziak*, being headed by *Bedirag Bai*, a Famous Commander among the Tartars. The Han seeing himself thus forsaken, went back likewise towards *Budziak*; There were with him two Turkish Officers, who were sent from the Port to hasten the march of the Tartars, one of whom went to acquaint the Visier with what had happened, and the other returned with the Han to see the conclusion of this Affair.

**Paris, Septemb. 5.** The Letters from *Grenoble* of the 29th say, That the Duke of *Savoie* was encamped on the Hill of *Calion*, having sent out Parties to raise Contributions in the Neighbouring Country; That he had caused a Bridge to be laid over the *Durance* at *Sarvines*, and it was Reported that his Royal Highness would send some Troops into *Provence*. *Comar Passilly* with his Troops about *Susa*, and seemed to have a design upon that place, whither *Monieur Catinat* has sent a strong Reinforcement. The *Marquis de Revel* is on his march with 4000 Men from our Army in *Catalonia* towards *Dauphine*. We hear that some of our Men of War have taken a Spanish Ship of about 56 pieces of Cannon and 300 Men, and brought her to *Rechefort*.

From His Majesties Camp at *Grammen*, Septemb. 8. We had an account two days since that the Detachment which lately marched from hence, under the Command of Lieutenant General *Talush*, had posted themselves at *Burnes*, between *Newport* and *Dunkirk*, where the Duke of *Lombes* arrived yesterday with the Forces under his Command, in order to some farther Undertaking; And this Morning were detached from hence 5 Regiments of Horse to join them. The Duke of *Luxemburg* is still about *Courtray*; but the *Marquis de Boufflers* marched on Thursday last in great haste towards *Nassau*.

**Hague, Sept. 9.** The Forces of *Brandenburg* and *Leige* have passed the *Muse* at *Huy*, and taken their march towards *Charleroy*, in order, as it is said, to enter into the French Territories between the *Sambre* and the *Meuse*; and we are told, that the Troops of *Nieburg*, *Cologne*, and *Brabant*, are to take their Posts about *Lege*. The Landgrave of *Hesse* has passed the *Rhine* at *Mainheim*.

**Barnstable, August 30.** On Sunday last arrived here the *Friendship* of this Place, *Andrew Carder* Master, from *Virginia*, who Reports, That about Three Weeks since he was separated off of *Newfoundland* from our homeward Bound *Virginia* Fleet, consisting of above 90 Sail, under the Convey of two Men of War.

**Deal, September 3.** This Morning arrived in the *Downes* 54 Sail of English Merchant Men, from *Virginia*, under the Convey of Their Majesties Ships the *Affurance*, and *Arch-Angel*, the rest of the Fleet being put into several of the Western Ports to which they were Bound.
