Notice is hereby given that Their Majesties the King and Queen will hold a series of Courts at Buckingham Palace during the coming season, at which presentations of Ladies to Their Majesties will be made.

Attendance and Presentation at these Courts will be by Summons issued by the Lord Chamberlain.

Ladies who have already been presented and who are desirous of being summoned to these Courts are requested to send in their names, on, or as soon as possible after, the 1st January next, together with those of their husbands (if they desire to be accompanied by them, and if they have been presented), to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace. Should they desire to make a presentation, the name of the Lady to be presented should be sent in at the same time. The Lord Chamberlain will be glad if Ladies will state, in addition, when it will be most convenient to them to pay their respects to Their Majesties, *i.e.*, whether before or after Easter.

Gentlemen who come in attendance on their families are not expected to pass the Presence.

A Lady who makes a presentation to Their Majesties must be personally acquainted with and responsible for the Lady she presents. She must herself attend the Court, and cannot present more than one Lady in addition to her daughter or daughter-in-law.

If it should not be convenient for a Lady to attend or be presented at the particular Court to which she is summoned, it will be open to her to make her excuses to the Lord Chamberlain in writing, when her name can, if desired, and if possible, be transferred to another List.

The Courts will be held in the evening.

The Dress Regulations are:—Ladies: Full Court dress, with feathers and trains. Gentlemen: Full Court dress.

N.B.—The following notice was published by authority on the 11th February, 1901:—

“The Lord Chamberlain is authorized by the King to give notice that Ladies and Gentlemen who have been presented at Drawing Rooms and Levées held during the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, will not require to be again presented to Their Majesties the King and Queen.”

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-second day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the estate and interest hereinafter described in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called ‘the said benefice’) of Stevenage, in the county of Hertford and in the diocese of Saint Albans.

“Whereas the advowson or right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Stevenage is for the residue of a term of five hundred years, dating from the sixth day of June, in the year one thousand six hundred and five, vested in Arthur Day, of Number 28, Great George-street, in the city of Westminster, Solicitor.

“And whereas the said Arthur Day is desirous that all the estate and interest in the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Stevenage which is now vested in him as aforesaid shall be

transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Saint Albans for the time being.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edgar, now Bishop of Saint Albans, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Edgar, Bishop of Saint Albans, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas it appears to us that the transfer of the said estate and interest in the patronage of the said benefice of Stevenage which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the said right of patronage or advowson arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Stevenage.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Arthur Day (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Edgar, Bishop of Saint Albans (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole of the estate and interest in the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Stevenage, which is now vested in him the said Arthur Day as aforesaid, shall be transferred from him to the said Edgar, Bishop of Saint Albans and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edgar, Bishop of Saint Albans, and by his successors in the same bishoprick.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint Albans.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eight, and of the Act of the twenty-first and

twenty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-seven, which Acts are known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts," duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the sixth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, in the words following, that is to say:--

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eight, and of the Act of the twenty-first and twenty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-seven, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme relating to the vicarage and parish of Frodingham, in the county and diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas the annual value of the benefice of Frodingham, that is to say, of the vicarage of the parish of Frodingham aforesaid, has been improved by means of a lease of the Ironstone under a portion of the glebe lands of the said benefice which lease was granted under the authority of the said Acts by the Reverend Edward Mitford Weigall, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the said vicarage of Frodingham.

"And whereas the rents, royalties, and other reservations by the said lease reserved and made payable to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have from time to time as the same have been received by us been invested in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts, and of such investments there remain standing in the name of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, first, a sum of fourteen thousand seven hundred and twelve pounds eleven shillings and threepence India three pounds per centum Stock; secondly, a sum of twenty thousand five hundred and thirty-nine pounds nine shillings and ninepence London County three pounds per centum Stock; and, thirdly, a sum of nineteen thousand one hundred and forty-four pounds sixteen shillings and tenpence Metropolitan Consolidated three pounds per centum Stock, all which said sums of stock are now held by us in trust to pay the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the said parish of Frodingham the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon, but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the vicarage of Frodingham aforesaid from the said lease payable to us for the benefit of our common fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And whereas notwithstanding the appropriations already made out of the said invested proceeds of the said lease, and the further appropriation thereof for the augmentation of the benefice of Scunthorpe, which by an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council of the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine (published in the London Gazette of the twentieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine), is directed to be made as from the date of the next vacation of the said vicarage of Frodingham, the improvement in the annual value of the said vicarage of Frodingham arising from or by means of the said lease exceeds the annual sum of eight hundred and fifty pounds, and after so much of the said income shall have ceased to be payable to the Vicar or Incumbent of the said vicarage of Frodingham, and shall in accordance with the recommendation hereinafter contained have become payable to us for the benefit of our common fund, the average annual income of the

said vicarage of Frodingham will not be left at a less sum than six hundred pounds.

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the date of the next vacation of the said vicarage of Frodingham such portion or portions as shall then be determined by us of the stocks hereinbefore mentioned, or of any stocks, funds, or securities by which the said stocks shall then be represented, being a portion or portions from which the interest or dividends arising or accruing shall be sufficient to produce a yearly income of eight hundred and fifty pounds shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the parish of Frodingham aforesaid, and shall be held by us for the benefit of our common fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the notice of the foregoing scheme, which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, has been given by the said Commissioners to the patron of the said benefice of Frodingham, and the said patron has not made any objection to the said scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lincoln.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the eighth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Gabriel, situate at Abergwynfi, within the parish of Llangynwyd,

in the county of Glamorgan, and in the diocese of Llandaff.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Llangynwyd, and of the parish of Glyn-corrwg, in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Llangynwyd, and of the said parish of Glyn-corrwg, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Gabriel, situate at Abergwynfi as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff, as such Bishop, and also as the patron (in right of his See) of the vicarage of the said parish of Llangynwyd, and with the consent of John Edwards Vaughan, of Rheola, Glyn Neath, in the county of Glamorgan, Esquire, one of Your Majesty's Justices of the Peace, as the patron of the vicarage of the said parish of Glyn-corrwg (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Llangynwyd and of the said parish of Glyn-corrwg, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Gabriel, situate at Abergwynfi as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Avan Vale.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Avan Vale, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the parish of Llangynwyd, in the county of Glamorgan, and in the diocese of Llandaff, which is comprised within the limits of the urban district of Glyn-corrwg.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the parish of Glyn-corrwg, in the said county and diocese, which is bounded upon the east partly by the district chapelry of Saint George, Uwmparc, and partly by the parish of Llangeinor, both in the said county and diocese, upon the south by the above described portion of the said parish of Llangynwyd, upon the west by the parish of Michaelston-super-Avan, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Michaelston-super-Avan from the said parish of Glyn-corrwg at the point where the stream called Nant Troed-y-zhiw joins the stream called Nant Crogen, and extending thence eastward and in a straight line (thereby crossing the hill called Pen-craig-isaf, the stream called Afon Corrwg, the mountain called Mynydd-Rhiw-llech, the stream called Nant Boeth, and the mountain called Mynydd

Abergwynfi) for a distance of two miles and sixty-nine chains or thereabouts to the point near the Corrwg Rhondda Colliery, where the stream called Nant Gwynfi is joined by the stream called Nant Lluest, and extending thence eastward in precisely the same direction, and in a straight line (thereby crossing the mountain called Mynydd Blaen-gwynfi) for a distance of one mile and twenty-eight chains or thereabouts to a point at Bwlch Nant-gwyn upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Glyn-corrwg from the said district chapelry of Saint George, Cwmparc."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Llandaff.

**W**HEREAS by section four of the Domicile Act, 1861, it is enacted that whenever a Convention shall be made between His Majesty and any Foreign State, whereby His Majesty's Consuls or Vice-Consuls in such Foreign State shall receive the same or the like powers and authorities as are hereinafter expressed, it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council to direct, and from and after the publication of such Order in the London Gazette it shall be and is hereby enacted, that whenever any subject of such Foreign State shall die within the dominions of His Majesty and there shall be no person present at the time of such death who shall be rightfully entitled to administer to the estate of such deceased person, it shall be lawful for the Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent of such Foreign State within that part of His Majesty's Dominions where such foreign subject shall die to take possession and have the custody of the personal property of the deceased, and to apply the same in payment of his or her debts and funeral expenses, and to retain the surplus for the benefit of the persons entitled thereto; but such Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent shall immediately apply for and shall be entitled to obtain from the proper Court letters of administration of the effects of such deceased person, limited in such a manner and for such time as to such Court shall seem fit.

And whereas a Convention between His Majesty the King and His Majesty the Emperor of Japan was made on the twenty-sixth April, one thousand nine hundred, and ratified on the twenty-fifth October, one thousand nine hundred, whereby it is provided:

I. That whenever a subject of one of the High Contracting Parties shall die within the dominions

of the other and there shall be no person present at the time of such death who shall be rightly entitled to administer the estate of such deceased person, the following rules shall be observed:

(1) When the deceased leaves, in the above named circumstances, heirs of his or her own nationality only, or who may be qualified to enjoy the civil status of their father or mother, as the case may be, the Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent of the country to which the deceased belonged, on giving notice to the proper authorities, shall take possession and have custody of the property of the said deceased, shall pay the expenses of the funeral, and retain the surplus for the payment of his or her debts, and for the benefit of the heirs to whom it may rightly belong.

But the said Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent shall be bound immediately to apply to the proper Court for letters of administration of the effects left by the deceased, and these letters shall be delivered to him with such limitations and for such time as to such Court may seem right.

(2.) If, however, the deceased leaves in the country of his or her decease and in the above named circumstances, any heir or universal legatee of other nationality than his or her own, or to whom the civil status of his or her father or his or her mother, as the case may be, cannot be granted, then each of the two Governments may determine whether the proper Court shall proceed according to law, or shall confide the collection and administration to the respective Consular Officers under the proper limitations. When there is no Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent in the locality where the decease has occurred (in the case contemplated by the first rule of this article) upon whom devolves the custody and administration of the estate, the proper authority shall proceed in these acts until the arrival of the respective Consular Officers.

II. That the stipulations of the Convention shall be applicable so far as the laws permit, to all the Colonies and foreign possessions of His Majesty, excepting to those hereinafter named, that is to say, except to India, the Dominion of Canada, Newfoundland, The Cape, Natal, New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, Tasmania, South Australia, Western Australia, and New Zealand; provided always that the stipulations of the Convention shall be made applicable to any of the above named Colonies or foreign possessions, on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given to the Japanese Government by His Majesty's Representative at Tokyo, within two years from the date of the exchange of ratifications of the Convention.

III. That the Convention shall remain in force until the seventeenth July, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

And whereas within the period prescribed by Article II the stipulations of the Convention have been made applicable to the Colonies of The Cape, New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, Tasmania, South Australia and Western Australia, and to India:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that whenever any subject of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan shall die during the currency of the Convention within any of the dominions of His Majesty the King to which the stipulations of the Convention are applicable, and there shall be no person present at the time of such death who shall be

rightfully entitled to administer to the estate of such deceased person, it shall be lawful for the Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent, of the Japanese Government within that part of His Majesty's Dominions where such Japanese subject shall die, to take possession and have the custody of the personal property of the deceased, and to apply the same in payment of his or her debts and funeral expenses, and to retain the surplus for the benefit of the persons entitled thereto; but such Consul, Vice-Consul or Consular Agent shall immediately apply for and shall be entitled to obtain from the proper Court letters of administration of the effects of such deceased person, limited in such manner and for such time as to such Court shall seem fit.

WHEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the dominions of His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar:

And whereas an Order in Council providing for the exercise of such jurisdiction, intituled "The Zanzibar Order in Council, 1906," was duly enacted by His Majesty in Council on the eleventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and six;

And whereas it was provided by the said Order that as to certain matters and things the said Order should commence and have effect immediately from and after the expiration of one month after the said Order was first exhibited in the public office of His Majesty's Court for Zanzibar, for which purpose the Judge of the said Court was required on receipt by him of a copy of the said Order forthwith to exhibit the same in the public office of the said Court;

And whereas it is desirable to postpone the commencement of the said Order as to such matters and things.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1.) The Zanzibar Order in Council, 1906, shall, except as to the making of any warrant or appointment, or the framing of rules of procedure or regulations, and the approval thereof by the Secretary of State, commence and have effect on such day as the Secretary of State shall appoint.

(2.) A notice shall be published at Zanzibar by His Majesty's Agent and Consul-General, specifying the date on which the Secretary of State has appointed that the said Order shall commence.

(3.) From and after the issue of such notice the Judge of the Court for Zanzibar shall, on receipt of a copy of the said Order, affix the same in a conspicuous place in the public office of the said Court, and keep the same exhibited until the day appointed by the Secretary of State for the commencement of the Order.

2. Article 58, Sub-Article (3) of "The Zanzibar Order in Council, 1906," is hereby repealed.

3. This Order may be cited as "The Zanzibar Order in Council, 1906, No. 2."

And the Right Honourable Sir Edward Grey, Baronet, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

WHEREAS by the Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891, His Majesty the King is authorized by Order in Council to fix the fees to be taken in respect of any matter or thing done by a Consular officer in the execution of his office, and to vary such fees by way of increase or decrease, and to abolish fees, and to create new fees:

And whereas by the Foreign Marriage Act, 1892, and by the Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1892, made in pursuance of that Act, it is provided that certain things may or shall be done on payment of the proper fee, and that Act further provides that the proper fee shall be such fee as may for the time being be fixed under the first recited Act, and that the fee so fixed as respects a Consul shall be the fee which may be taken by any Marriage officer:

And whereas it is expedient that the Table of Fees fixed by the Consular Fees (General) Order in Council, 1892, should in certain respects be amended, and that the whole of the fees to be taken by Consular officers and Marriage officers should be fixed by an Order in Council made under the provisions of the Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the before-mentioned Acts, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as "The Consular Fees (General) Order in Council, 1906."

2. The several fees set forth in the Tables annexed to this Order are hereby established, and the said Tables and notes thereto shall be construed as part of this Order.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of March, 1907, or at such later date as in the case of any particular Consular jurisdiction, or part thereof, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by any general or particular instructions, may from time to time direct.

4. ## NOTES.

1. If a Consular officer should be named Commissioner to examine witnesses under a Commission issued by a British Court of Justice he is allowed to act as such, charging and retaining the customary fees for so doing. A Consular officer should, however, before undertaking the office, come

to an arrangement with the parties at whose instance the Commission is being issued as to the exact scale of fees to be charged.

WHEREAS by the Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891, His Majesty the King is authorized by Order in Council to fix the fees to be taken in respect of any matter or thing done by a Consular Officer in the execution of his office, and to vary such fees by way of increase or decrease, and to abolish fees and to create new fees;

And whereas by the Foreign Marriage Act, 1892, and by the Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1892, made in pursuance of that Act, it is provided that certain things may or shall be done on payment of the proper fee, and that Act further provides that the proper fee shall be such fee as may for the time being be fixed under the first recited Act, and that the fee so fixed, as respects a Consul, shall be the fee which shall be taken by any marriage officer;

And whereas it is expedient that the Table of fees fixed by the China and Corea (Consular and Marriage Fees) Order in Council, 1904, should, in certain respects, be amended, and that the whole of the fees to be taken by Consular officers and marriage officers in China and Corea should be fixed by an Order in Council made under the provisions of the Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891;

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the before-mentioned Acts, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The China and

Corea (Consular and Marriage Fees) Order in Council, 1906."

2. The several fees set forth in the Tables annexed to this Order are hereby established, and the said Tables and notes thereto shall be construed as part of this Order.

3. The fees to be paid and taken in respect of matters arising under the China and Corea (Shipping Registry) Order in Council, 1904, shall be the fees contained in the Tables annexed to this Order numbered 1 to 9H respectively.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of March, 1907, or at such later date as, in the case of any particular Consular jurisdiction or part thereof, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by any general or particular instructions, may from time to time direct.

5. On and after the day when this Order comes into operation in any place to which this Order applies, the China and Corea (Consular and Marriage Fees) Order in Council, 1904, and Article 17 (2) and the Second Schedule of the China and Corea (Shipping Registry) Order in Council, 1904, shall be repealed as to that place without prejudice to any right or liability existing at the commencement of this Order in that place.

6. In this Order the expression "Consular jurisdiction" means the district, place, or places for which a Consular officer acts.

7. This Order shall extend to all places in China and Corea.

And the Right Honourable Sir Edward Grey, Baronet, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish of All Saints, Fonthill Bishop, in the county of Wilts; of the parish of Saint Mary, Strensall, in the North Riding of Yorkshire; of the parish of Saint Mary, West Bergholt, in the county of Essex; of the parish of Saint John, Longsight, in the city of Manchester; and of the parish of Saint Aelhaiarn, Guilsfield, in the borough of Welshpool, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representations, made representations stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial grounds should be opened in the civil parishes of Fonthill Bishop, Strensall, and West Bergholt, or in the city of Manchester, or in the borough of Welshpool, without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials should be discontinued in the said parishes as hereinafter directed:
