Venices July 14. From the Levant we are with much confidence informed that the Turks before Candia, growing almost desperate that all their endeavours have been hitherto with fo tittle fuccels for reduction of the City, refolved to-fumme up all their ftrength, and at the fame time to make their Affaults upon four feveral parts of the Town, which they accordingly put into execution, and with great cryes fell upon the Outworks at the Forts of St. Dennis, St. An-drew, the Sabronera, and the Panigra, but were received with in finite courage by the Defendants in all places, and forced off again with great flughter: their greatest affault-wasma e upon the Eost Panigra, where they came on with fuch viole ce and numbers, that they posself them-, felves of a fmall Work or Redoubt a lit le wirk par the Forsand continued therein all the nights but the next morning by break of, day, the Defendants made a flour fally upon them, commanded by Seignior Carbonaros an excellent Soldiers and Ingeneer, who in white Armour fell io vigorously, upon, the Edemys that after a few hours thatp dire putes they dillodged them in fpight of all the fuecours that were fent to saint them ; but at their departure, the Encmy firing a Mise under the Work, which hurt leveral of our men, killing many of their own peoples and abour 30 of ours, amongst whom was the Seignior Carbonaro, who had in this days fervices as in feveral other encounters, given execclient proofs of his courage. In this Alfault, the Turks loft above 1000 men'; in re-

venge whereof, they have fince played with much fury upon the Town with their Canon and Imall fhot, by one of which latter, the General Bognardo Mani has received a hurt in-his head, and fome Soldiers have been fhot upon the walls.

Our Admiral has divided the Fleet into four Squadrons, which lie cruifing upon the Coafts of the Illand, and has ordered the Commanders of each Squadron to engage any part of the Ottoman Eleer which shall endeavour to fuccour the Vifier. The Sease between Scios and Tenolos are fil-led with the Christian Privateers, who daily meet with con-fiderable prizesy bound either for the Ifland, with provisions for their Army, or from Conffantinople, with a lupply for that place; which by reason of the long continuance of the War, ad the frequent intercepting of their fbips, is reduced to great wants. The Torks ftill give out that the Grand Segnic continues his relolution of coming in perfon into Mored, to encourage the Siege by his nearer approach.
