At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 1st day of March, 1907.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS by the twenty-seventh section of the Supreme Court of Judicature Act, 1873, it is enacted that His Majesty in Council may, from time to time, upon any report or recommendation of the Council of Judges in the said Act mentioned, with the consent of the Lord Chancellor, make, revoke, or modify orders regulating the vacations to be observed by the High Court of Justice and the Court of Appeal, and in the offices of the Supreme Court respectively.

And whereas at a meeting of the Judges of the Supreme Court duly assembled at His Majesty's Royal Courts of Justice on the eleventh day of January, one thousand nine hundred and seven, it was resolved:

That it be humbly recommended to His Majesty that an Order in Council be made, if His Majesty shall so please, directing that the Long Vacation should both commence and terminate twelve days earlier than at present: and whereas it has seemed fit to His Majesty by and with the advice of His Privy Council that the said recommendation be carried into effect.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:

That the Trinity Sittings of the Court of Appeal and of the High Court of Justice shall, for the future, terminate on the thirty-first day of July, and that the Long Vacation in the several Courts and offices of the Supreme Court shall, for all purposes, commence on the first day of August.

That the Michaelmas Sittings of the same Courts respectively shall, for the future, commence on the twelfth day of October, and that the Long Vacation in the several Courts and offices of the Supreme Court shall, for all purposes, terminate on the eleventh of October.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, as subsequently amended, certain arrangements as regards the circuits of the judges were approved:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order be amended on account of certain alterations which have been made in the dates of the Long Vacation in the Supreme Court:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

In the Order in Council relating to circuits dated the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, the Schedule to this Order shall be substituted for the Schedule to the said Order of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and the said Order in Council shall take effect subject to the substitution made by this Order, and any copy thereof hereafter printed may be printed with the substitution made by this Order.

When Whit Sunday falls before the twenty-first of May, the dates shall be altered so as to enable these circuits to end on the Thursday before Whit Sunday.
