WESTON GREEN FAIR, THAMES DITTON.

Whereas a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Urban District Council of Esher and the Dittons, to the effect that a Fair has been annually held, on Whit-Monday, upon common land at Weston Green, Thames Ditton, in the county of Surrey, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when I would take the same into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of the Fairs Act, 1871:

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Fairs Act, 1871, do hereby order that the Fair which has been annually held on Whit-Monday, upon common land at Weston Green, Thames Ditton, in the county of Surrey, shall be abolished.
