

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 15TH MARCH 1907.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Transfer of Parishes for Certain Purposes.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the parishes described in the First Schedule hereto shall for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 cease to form part of the Area firstly described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall form part of the Area secondly described in such Schedule.

Provision for Movement through Scheduled Areas by Road.

2. Swine shall not be deemed to be moved into either of the Areas described in the Second Schedule hereto, as altered by this Order, in any case where they are moved through the Area in a float van or cart from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area in accordance with the following conditions:—

(1.) The swine must be accompanied by a licence authorising the movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of each District within the Area through which they are to be moved; and

(2.) the swine must not within the Area be removed from the float van or cart, or be permitted to come in contact with other swine.

(3.) The swine must be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of March, nineteen hundred and seven.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Parishes transferred for purposes of Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903.

The parishes of Finningley and Misson, in the administrative county of Nottingham.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising the administrative counties of Derby and Nottingham, and the county boroughs of Derby and Nottingham.

An Area comprising the administrative counties of the East and West Ridings of the county of York, and the county boroughs of Bradford, Halifax, Huddersfield, and York.

CAITHNESS-SHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS)
ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of the District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of
