"Whereas by an Order in Council of Her late Majesty, bearing date the fifth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, sauction was given for the payment of Commuted Allowances on the following scale to the Commandersin-Chief at the three Home Ports to enable them to provide their own servants in place of the Naval domestics allowed :-

Commander-in-Chief, Portsmouth ... ditto Devonport 500 Nore .

these rates having been fixed with reference to the cost of providing the Naval domestics in the respective numbers concerned, the appointments at Portsmouth and Devonport being held at the time by Admirals and that at the Nore by a Vice-Admiral:

"And whereas the importance of these commands varies from time to time:

" And whereas the command at the Nore has been held by an Admiral since the twentieth October, one thousand nine hundred and four:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to empower us to award at our discretion to the Commanders-in-Chief at the three Home Ports such rate of Commuted Allowance in lieu of servants, within a maximum of £500 a year, as in our opinion the circumstances of each case may warrant, this authority to have retrospective effect to the twentieth October, one thousand nine hundred and four.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's

Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas it is provided in the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service that Petty Officers, Seamen and Boys are to be credited with certain gratuities on account of

Clothing and Bedding:

And whereas it would facilitate the arrangements for kitting up, and simplify accounts, if the Clothing and Bedding, in certain instances, were supplied free of charge, instead of crediting the men with gratuities and afterwards recovering the value of the articles issued:

And whereas we consider it desirable that Petty Officers, Seamen and Boys in Your Majesty's Navy should not bear the expense of providing new Hat Ribbons when transferred to

another ship or depôt:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us at our discretion to issue Hat Ribbons free of charge in such circumstances; and also to authorize the following modifications in the existing system of Clothing and Bedding gratuities as from the first April, one thousand nine hundred and seven,

"Bedding Gratuity on first entry to be abolished, and a set of Bedding to be supplied

free instead:

"Clothing Gratuity to be credited only in cases where the amount of the gratuity payable under the Regulations is insufficient to cover the whole cost of the necessary Clothing; in all other cases the gratuity to be abolished and Clothing supplied free instead.

"We further beg leave to recommend that Ships' Stewards' Boys and Boy Writers, who are now entitled to a Clothing Gratuity of five pounds only, shall in future be supplied with a Regu-

lation Kit free of charge on first entry.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The following Statutes, made by the Governing Body of Emmanuel College, Cambridge, and sealed on the seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seven, amending certain of the Statutes of the College, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so

submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":-

#### EMMANUEL COLLEGE, CAMBRIDGE.

#### Alteration of Statutes.

Whereas Emmanuel College in the University of Cambridge is now governed by a code of Statutes made under the authority of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877. and approved by Her late Majesty the Queen in Council on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, as altered by certain amending Statutes approved by Her Majesty the Queen in Council on the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and further altered by certain amending Statutes approved by Her late Majesty the Queen in Council on the nineteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight;

And whereas it is expedient to alter certain of the said Statutes and also certain of the said

amending Statutes;

we the Governing Body of the said College by virtue of the said Act and according to the provisions thereof do by a resolution passed at a General Meeting of the said Governing Body specially summoned for the purpose by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting make the following alterations in the aforesaid Statutes as altered by the said amending Statutes.

#### Statute XII.—Of the qualification of the Fellows.

By repealing section 3 of Statute XII and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 3 of the same Statute:

3. The Junior Fellows shall be chosen from those who have graduated at Cambridge or Oxford or some other University.

Statute XIII.—Of the election of Fellows.

By inserting between sections 13 and 14 of Statute XIII the following section to be numbered 13A:

13A. The Governing Body shall have power at the time of any election to a Fellowship to attach to the tenure of the Fellowship any special condition which may seem to them desirable. On any breach of a condition so attached a majority of the whole Governing Body shall have power to declare the Fellowship vacant.

Statute XV.—Of the tenure of the Fellowships.

By repealing sections 5 and 6 of Statute XV and substituting therefor the following sections to form amended sections 5 and 6 of the same

5. A Senior Fellow who has held the office of Senior Tutor for fifteen years or any one or more of the offices of Dean, Tutor, Assistant Tutor, Lecturer or Bursar for a continuous period of twenty-five years (whether the office so held has been the same throughout or not) shall be entitled to retain his Fellowship for life provided that the period of any intermission of duties allowed under section 7B of this Statute shall not be reckoned in computing the qualifying period of twentyfive years.

6. A Junior Fellow shall be entitled to retain his Fellowship for six years less seven days from the date of his election but no longer. A Junior Fellow however shall be entitled to receive the dividends of a Fellow-

ship in respect of the said seven days.

By inserting between sections 7 and 8 of Statute XV the two following sections to be numbered respectively 7A and 7B:—

7A. The Governing Body may by a vote in which at least two-thirds of the whole number of its members for the time being concur re-elect a Junior Fellow who is performing any duties that may have been attached to his Fellowship under Statute XIII, section 13A, or is engaged in any special study or research for a period of three or of six years as they shall at the time of his re-election determine.

7s. If any Fellow is prevented by ill-health or other grave cause from fulfilling his duties continuously he may be allowed by a vote in which two-thirds of the Governing Body concur to intermit his duties for a period not exceeding one year and a similar exemption may be granted to him at the end of such year and so on from time to time as the Governing Body may think fit.

#### Statute XIX.—Of Residence.

By repealing section 4 of Statute XIX and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 4 of the same Statute:—

4. Every College Officer or Fellow who is fulfilling the duty of residence under this Statute shall sleep in College at least five nights in each week and if he shall be absent on either of the remaining nights he shall have a Deputy approved by the Master and such Deputy shall sleep in College. Provided always that a house communicating with the College and approved by the Governing Body shall for the purposes of this section be deemed to be within the College. Provided also that except in the case last aforesaid no person except the Master shall be allowed to have residing with him in College his wife and family.

Statute XXI.—Of payments and allowances to Fellows.

By repealing the existing Statute XXI and substituting therefor the following Statute to form an amended Statute XXI:—

#### XXI.

Each Fellow shall receive the share of the College revenue allotted to him by Statute XLIII. He shall also be entitled to dinner in Hall without payment and in respect of each night which he shall spend in College to one day's buttery commons or in lieu thereof to an allowance the amount of which shall be determined from time to time by the Governing Body. He shall also be entitled if residing in College to occupy rent free any one vacant set of rooms not required by a Fellow resident in College senior to himself. The Governing Body may however for disciplinary purposes or for other special reasons direct that any vacant set of rooms be offered to any Fellow or Officer residing in College and may also assign to any Fellow or Officer though not residing in College the use or partial use of a set of rooms to assist him in the performance of his duties either to the College or to the University.

Statute XXX.—Of the Assistant Tutors, Lecturers and Educational Board.

By repealing section 1 of Statute XXX and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 1 of the same Statute:—

1. The Tutors shall be assisted in their

educational duties by Lecturers who shall be appointed by the Educational Board hereinafter constituted. There may be one or more Assistant Tutors who shall be chosen by the same Board from those persons who are holding or are immediately about to hold a Lectureship in the College.

Statute XLI.—Of presentations to Benefices. By repealing section 2 of Statute XLI.

DISEASES OF ANIMALS (LANARKSHIRE) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations for Notification of Illness of Cattle.

- 1. The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make regulations-
  - (1.) For prescribing and regulating the notice to be given to or by any person or authority in the case of illness of any head of cattle, and for supplementing or varying for

those purposes any of the provisions of section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894;

(2.) For regulating the burial of the carcase of any head of cattle to which any notice of illness relates.

#### Limitation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Nothing in any regulations made under this Order shall require notice to be given—

(i.) In the case of illness produced by, or consequent on, accident or calving; or

(ii.) Where the illness is certified by a Veterinary Surgeon as not being cattle-plague, pleuro-pneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease or anthrax

2. Nothing in any regulations made under this Order shall affect the provisions of any Order of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries relating to cattle-plague, pleuro-pneumonia, foot-andmouth disease or anthrax.

#### Confirmation of Regulations.

3.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District four weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For four weeks at least before an application, a copy of the regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed regu-

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them

in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

- 1.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from animals not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or suspected to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the horse, ass, or mule so affected or suspected is.
- 2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

# Veterinary Inquiry by Local Authority as to existence of Parasitic Mange.

- 2.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving information of the existence, or supposed existence, of parasitic mange shall forthwith cause inquiry to be instituted as to the correctness of such information with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a veterinary practitioner qualified according to the Act of 1894 to be a Veterinary Inspector.
- (2.) The owner and occupier of any premises on which there is a horse affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange, shall give all reasonable facilities for the inquiry by the Local Authority under this Article, and any person failing to give such facilities shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Detention of Animals.

- 3.—(1.) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authoritý may serve a Notice (in the Form A set forth in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect) on the occupier of any stable, shed, field or other premises in which there is a horse, ass, or mule, which in his opinion is affected with parasitic mange, and thereupon the following restrictions shall take effect:
  - (i.) The horse, ass, or mule so affected shall not be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises specified in the Notice, except with the written authority, and under the supervision, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and only to some other place of detention; and during the detention it shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, be treated by the owner thereof with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;
  - (ii.) No other horse, ass, or mule shall be moved out of the stable, shed, field, or other premises, unless on each occasion immediately before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority.
- (2.) A Notice under this Order shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by a Notice in writing served on the occupier of the premises by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

-(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:

- (i.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange:
- (ii.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be effected:
- (iii.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee, or occupier:
- (iv.) For requiring the removal by the owner from contact with horses, asses, or mules, of litter used for or about any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange.
- (2.) The mode of disinfection shall be one of those prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (3.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, or to remove any litter, in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feedingtrough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, to be cleansed and disinfected, or to remove such litter, and to recover summarily the expenses thereby incurred from such person.
- (4.) Where the power conferred by the preceding provisions of this Article is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee, or occupier of the place to be cleansed and disinfected shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

- 5.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Order.
- (2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

6. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences or procedure. Exemption of Army Veterinary Department and Veterinary Colleges.

7. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass, or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Department, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

#### Offences.

- 8.—(1.) If a horse, ass, or mule is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice under this Order, the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the horse, ass, or mule is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of this Order, or of any Regulation made thereunder, the owner and the lessee and the occupier and the person in charge of any place or thing in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any owner, occupier, or person in charge of premises requiring to be cleansed and disinfected fails to give the facilities to a Local Authority required under this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector:
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Extent.

NEWCASTLE - UPON - TYNE (BYKER AND WALKER PIGGERIES) (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903. and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Premises to which this Order applies.

- 1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the county borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of that borough and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.
- (2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the said Local Authority.

#### Restriction on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies; Provided that this Order shall not affect the movement of swine under and in accordance with a licence granted under any other Order of the Board.

#### Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

- 3.-(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies in a suitable vehicle to a slaughter-house situate in the county borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, for the purpose of immediate slaughter with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of that borough, which Licence shall be in force for not more than two days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the slaughter-house to which the swine are to be moved.
- (2.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (3.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and shall be slaughtered after their arrival at the slaughter-house, without unnecessary delay.

# Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicle used for Movement of Swine.

- 4.—(1.) Any vehicle which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article, shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the owner of the vehicle as follows:
  - (i.) The floor of the vehicle and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then
  - (ii.) The same parts of the vehicle shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
  - (iii.) The same parts of the vehicle shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1206.
- (2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter,, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

# Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

- 5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the county borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, which Licence shall be in force for not more than six days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the place and premises to which the swine are to be moved, and shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the swine or of his agent authorised in writing for this purpose to the following effect—
  - (a.) that the swine to be moved have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence;
  - (b.) that the swine are not affected with swine-fever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever; and
  - (c.) that the swine are not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.
- (2.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (3.) The declaration as to swine to be moved shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the Licence thereon.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

#### . Local Authority to enforce Order.

7. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Offences.

- 8.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any vehicle used for the movement of swine, the owner, or other person for the time being in charge of the vehicle, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (5.) If a pig is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the person to whom the Licence is granted, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (6.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Interpretation.

9. In this Order-

- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be infected with swine-fever under any Order of the Board: Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

#### Commencement.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of March, nineteen hundred and seven.

#### Short Title.

11. This Order may be cited as the New-CASTLE-UPON-TYNE (BYKER AND WALKER PIGGERIES) (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1907.
