The Secretary for Scotland has made the
following Order in terms of the Wild Birds
Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904:—

WILD BIRDS (SCOTLAND.)

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Zetland)
Order, 1907.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me
by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to
1904, and upon application by the County Coun-
cil of the county of Zetland, I, the Right
Honourable John Sinclair, His Majesty's Secre-
tary for Scotland, do hereby make the following
Order:—

1. The whole of the county of Zetland is
hereby exempted from the operation of the Act
of 1880 as to the undermentioned birds:—

Lesser black-backed gull, herring gull, cor-
morant and shag.

2. This Order shall come into force on the first
day of May, 1907, and shall be published in the
London Gazette and in the Edinburgh Gazette.

3. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds
Protection (County of Zetland) Order, 1907.

For the purposes of the Electric Lighting Acts
1882 to 1890, and all Provisional Orders and
Licences made and issued thereunder, the
Board of Trade approve of the pattern and con-
struction of the meter (hereinafter described)
for the measurement of electrical quantity when
supplied on the constant potential continuous
current system, namely:—

The meter No. 102,804 deposited at the Board

Lancashire, and sealed by the Board of Trade,
and known as the New Type Continuous Current
Meter, Hamilton Patent.

Provided that the meter be as described in
the specification, with drawings, deposited at
the Board of Trade and dated and numbered
9th April, 1907, and H. 4425.

The Board of Trade further approve of the
means provided for fixing meters of this
description, and for connecting them with the
service lines as described in the specification
above referred to.
