county and diocese, upon the east partly by the parish of Chiddingstone, in the said county and diocese, and partly by the said parish of Hever, upon the south-east by the last named parish, upon the south-west and upon the west and upon the north-west by the parish of Edenbridge, in the said county and diocese.

"II. And also all that isolated portion of the said parish of Hever in which the house called Meachlands is situate and which is bounded upon the north by the said new parish of Four Elms and upon the south-east and upon the south-west by the above described detached portion of the said parish of Brasted."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninetyfour, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the twenty-first day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninetyfour, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of All Saints, Small Heath, in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Birmingham. "Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the fifth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and published in the London Gazette on the tenth day of the same month, a part of the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Bordesley, in the said county of Warwick, and at that time in the diocese of Worcester, but now in the said diocese of Birmingham, was constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and such district was named 'The District of All Saints, Small Heath.'

"And whereas the said district of All Saints, Small Heath, has become a new parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-sixth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven and published in the London Gazette on the second day of the following month, part of the said new parish of All Saints, Small Heath, was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Aidan, Small Heath, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Aidan, Small Heath, Birmingham.'

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of All Saints, Small Heath, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Birmingham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of All Saints, Small Heath, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said new parish of All Saints, Small Heath, which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said district chapelry of Saint Aidan, Small Heath, Birmingham.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.
