PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council WHEREAS by section twenty-six of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, "chapelries, and other places or districts may
be separated from the parishes or mother
churches to which they belong, with great
advantage, and places altogether extra-paro-" chial may in some instances with advantage be "annexed to parishes or districts to which they
"are contiguous, or be constituted separate
"parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is,
amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the " Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop " of any diocese shall represent to the said Arch-" bishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such "Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as "the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church and either be constituted a separate benefice "by itself or be united to any other parish to " which it may be more conveniently annexed, or " to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, " place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, " so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or " that any extra-parochial place may with advan-" tage be annexed to any parish to which it is "contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish " for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Arch-"bishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be "transmitted to the said Archbishop for his con-"sideration), describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be "effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical "jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights "to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by section eight of the Church Building Act, 1839, it is, amongst other things, further enacted, "That when by any Order of "His Majesty in Council, as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted "the same shall, on registration thereof, and " with the consent in writing of the Incumbent " or Incumbents of the benefice or benefices to " be thereby affected, become a perpetual curacy "and benefice, and the minister thereof, duly nominated and licensed thereto, and his "successors, shall be a body politic and cor-porate, with perpetual succession, and may receive and take to himself and his successors " all such lands, tenements, tithes, rent charges, "and hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or them, and such perpetual curate shall thenceforth have, within the limits of the district parish formed under the Church Build-"ing Acts, for the church of such perpetual curacy, sole and exclusive cure of souls, and "shall not in anywise be subject to the control or interference of the Incumbent or Incum-" bents of the benefice or benefices to be affected "by such Order, if he or they shall have con-" sented to such Order as aforesaid."

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Dalrymple, Lord Archbishop of York, hath certified to His Majesty in Council by his report dated the sixth day of April, one

thousand nine hundred and seven, as follows:—
"We, the undersigned William Dalrymple by
Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of York, being the Archbishop of the province within which the parish hereinafter referred to is situated, doth, in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and six, hereby report to Your Majesty in Council.

"That there is in the county and diocese of York the vicarage of Hornsea the parish whereof comprises amongst other places the township of Long Riston and part of the township of Arnold the limits and boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That there is within the limits of the township of Long Riston a chapel dedicated to Saint Margaret long since erected and built which chapel is situated at a distance of seven miles or thereabouts from the parish church of Hornsea aforesaid.

"That according to the last census the population of the said parish of Hornsea exclusive of the said township of Long Riston and part of the said township of Arnold amounts to two thousand nine hundred and ninety-two, and that of the said township of Long Riston and part of the township of Arnold to three hundred and sixty-eight or thereabouts.

"That the church or chapel situate in the said township of Long Riston affords sufficient accommodation for the inhabitants of the said township of Long Riston and part of the township of

"That baptisms, churchings, marriages and burials have been from time immemorial solemnized and performed in the chapel of the said township of Long Riston and the burial ground thereto belonging.

"That the annual value of the benefice of Hornsea is four hundred and forty-one pounds or thereabouts, exclusive of the residence house at Hornsea, which is now occupied by the Incumbent, the Reverend Charles Edward Little.

"That in the event of the scheme hereinafter proposed being carried into effect and the said township of Long Riston and part of the town-ship of Arnold being constituted a separate benefice of which the said chapel shall be the parish church, it is proposed to annex to such separate benefice by way of endowment the annual rent of the Glebe Farm, situate in the township of Long Riston, such farm consisting of one hundred and eighty-one acres or thereabouts and the annual rent thereof amounting to two hundred and fifteen pounds.

"That the patronage of the benefice of Hornsea belongs to the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain and the present Incumbent of the said benefice is the Reverend Charles Edward Little.

"That the Patron and Incumbent are consenting parties to the proposed separation.

"That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the session held in the first and second years of Her late Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and six, and of the second and third years of Her late Majesty's reign, chapter fortynine, the said township of Long Riston and part of the said township of Arnold may be advan-tageously separated from the vicarage and parish church of Hornsea and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes as well as a perpetual curacy and benefice.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the first-mentioned Act, the said Archbishop has prepared a scheme in writing appended to this report describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme, he doth by this report to Your Majesty in Council certify the same to Your Majesty together with the consent in writing to the said scheme of the Patron and Incumbent of the said benefice of Hornsea, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it shall be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying such scheme into effect.

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Archbishop and the consents referred to in the said report are in the words and figures following :-

"SCHEME.

"That the said township of Long Riston and part of the township of Arnold shall be separated from the parish and parish church of Hornsea and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes as well as a perpetual curacy and benefice by the name and style of 'The Perpetual Curacy of Long Riston,' of which the said chapel of Saint Margaret, situate within the said township of Long Riston, shall be the

"That such separate parish and benefice shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said vicarage of Hornsea, and the Incumbent of such separate parish and benefice shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same.

"That churchwardens shall be annually chosen in the customary manner, and at the time when churchwardens are usually appointed in and for the said separate parish and benefice, and such churchwardens shall be duly admitted, and shall do all things pertaining to the office of church-warden as to ecclesiastical matters in and for the said separate parish of Long Riston.

"That baptisms, churchings, marriages and burials shall be performed in the church of the said proposed separate parish and the burial ground thereto belonging.

"That the Vicar of Hornsea shall receive the whole of the income of the benefice of Hornsea as heretofore with the exception of the rent of the Glebe Farm, situate in the township of Long Riston, containing one hundred and eighty-one acres or thereabouts, the annual rent of which amounts to two hundred and fifteen pounds, payable half-yearly at Lady Day and Michaelmas, and which said farm is more particularly delineated and described in the schedule hereunder written, and the boundaries whereof are delineated on the plan hereto annexed.

"That the rent of the said farm shall form the income of the proposed separate parish of Long Riston, together with all surplice fees received in respect of offices performed in the said church of Saint Margaret, Long Riston, and shall be paid to and be received by the Minister or Incumbent of the said church of the proposed new parish.

"That the patronage or right of nomination of or to the said proposed separate parish and benefice of Long Riston shall be vested in and belong to the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being and his successors.

x "That the parishioners of the parish of Hornsea shall not henceforth be entitled to the right of accommodation in the church at Long Riston, and the parishioners of the proposed separate parish of Long Riston shall not henceforth be entitled to right of accommodation in the church at Hornsea.

"That the parishioners of the said separate parish and benefice of Long Riston shall be liable only for the payment of ecclesiastical dues and payments in respect of their said parish church situate within the limits of the proposed separate parish.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners VV for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirtynine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirtysecond years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and which said advowson or perpetual right of

laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-first day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, that is to say :-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called "the said benefice") of Saint Margaret, Underriver, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Margaret, Underriver, is vested in the Right Honourable Lionel Sackville, Baron Sackville, for an estate for his own life, and he the said Lionel Sackville, Baron Sackville, is the person who, if the said benefice were now

vacant, would be entitled to present thereto.

"And whereas the said Lionel Sackville,
Baron Sackville, is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Margaret, Underriver, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Rochester.

"And whereas the Right Reverend John Reginald, now Bishop of Rochester, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them is made necessary, he the said John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Saint Margaret, Underriver, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control and this circumstance will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the new parish of Saint Margaret, Underriver.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the said Lionel Sackville, Baron Sackville (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Margaret, Underriver, patronage is now vested for an estate for life as aforesaid in him, the said Lionel Sackville, Baron Sackville, shall be transferred to the said John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester, and by his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

THEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it was enacted that, in case it appeared to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground should be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case might require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances might require; provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it should please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, should be published in the London Gazette, and should be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation was so considered; provided also that no such representation should be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation should have been given to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of Waltham, in the county of Lincoln, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation, made a representation stating that they are of opinion that so much of the Order of Her late Majesty in Council of the fourteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, as varied by the Order in Council of the seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, as relates to burials in the church and churchyard of Waltham, in the county of Lincoln, should be further varied in the manner

hereinafter described:
And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the first day of March last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the twentieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said first recited Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that so much of the Order in Council of the fourteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, as varied by the Order in Council of the seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, as relates to burials in the church and churchyard of Waltham, in the county of Lincoln, be further varied so as to provide as follows, viz.:—

Waltham, Lincoln.—That burials shall also be discontinued forthwith and entirely in that portion of Waltham churchyard which was added in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, except as follows:—

(a.) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said portion of the church-yard, burial may be allowed, subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said portion of the churchyard the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave:

(c.) In the said portion of the churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein.

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish of Saint Paul, Ramsbottom, in the county of Lancaster, and of the parish of Holy Cross, Bury, in the county of Huntingdon, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representations, made representations stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial grounds should be opened in the civil parishes of Ramsbottom and Bury, without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials should be discontinued in the said parishes as hereinafter directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the eleventh day of February last, to give notice of such representations, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council,

on the thirtieth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in the said civil parishes without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued as follows, viz.:—

RAMSBOTTOM.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint Paul, Ramsbottom, in the county of Lancaster; and in the church-yard, except as follows:—

(a.) In the vault now existing in the said churchyard and belonging or reputed to belong to Henry Heys, burial may be allowed of the bodies of the said Henry Heys and his wife, Sophia Lord Heys, at their decease, subject to the condition that the coffin in each case be separately en closed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented;

(b.) In any walled grave now existing in the said churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented;

(c.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave.

BURY, HUNTINGDON.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of the Holy Cross, Bury, in the county of Huntingdon; and in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In the vault now existing in the said churchyard and belonging or reputed to belong to Mr. Mitchell, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented;

(b.) In the two walled graves now existing in the said churchyard and belonging or reputed to belong to the Rowells family, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such graves he separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the first day of March last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the twentieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burisl ground shall be opened in the said civil parish of Gringley-on-Hill, without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials in the said parish shall be discontinued as follows, viz.:—

2. The Bye-laws hereinafter set forth shall apply to all motor omnibuses belonging to the Council, and to all places within which the Council are authorized by the Todmorden Corporation Act, 1906, to provide and run motor

3. No person shall smoke any tobacco or any like substance inside any motor omnibus, or spit on the floor, platform, or roof, or on any part of any motor omnibus.

4. A person in a state of intoxication, or suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or whose dress or clothing may in the opinion of the guard soil or injure the linings or cushions of the motor omnibus, or a person who may for any reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any motor omnibus, and may be prevented from entering or mounting the same, and shall not enter or mount any motor omnibus after being requested not to do so by the guard, and if found in or upon the motor omnibus shall, on the request of the guard, quit the same upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned, and may be removed by or under the direction of the guard. Provided that on motor omnibuses run

artisan, mechanic or daily labourer shall be prevented from entering or mounting, or requested to leave an omnibus under the provisions of this bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

5. No person shall swear or use obscene, profane, or offensive language whilst in or upon any motor omnibus, or commit any nuisance in, or upon, or against any motor omnibus, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

6. No person, not being a servant of the Council, duly authorized in that behalf, shall touch, handle, or interfere with any machine or appliance in, under, upon, or about any motor omnibus (except electric bells provided for the use of passengers).

7. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the guard or other duly authorized officer of the Council, the fare egally demandable for the journey, and in any case, whether demanded or not, shall pay such fare before leaving the motor

omnibus.

8. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the guard or any duly authorized servant of the Council, and shall also, when required so to do, either show his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

9. Luggage of a form or description which in the opinion of the guard is calculated to annoy or inconvenience any passenger shall not be

taken in or upon any motor omnibus.

10. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Council employed in connection with a motor omnibus, shall travel on the steps of any motor omnibus or stand either on the roof or platform, or in the interior of any motor omnibus, or sit on the outside rail on the roof or platform of any motor omnibus.

11. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any motor omnibus, or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

- 12. When any motor omnibus contains the full number of passengers which it is authorized to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such motor omnibus after being warned by the guard not to do so.
- 13. No dog or other animal shall be allowed inside any motor omnibus. Any dog or other animal taken into any motor omnibus in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from inside the motor omnibus immediately upon request of the guard. Dogs taken outside the omnibus must be securely held in leash.
- 14. No person shall enter, get upon, or travel in or on any motor omnibus with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

15. No passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Council in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any motor omnibus.

16. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

17. The driver of a motor omnibus, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the motor omnibus to pass, shall sound his bell or horn or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle.

18. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding forty shillings.

19. There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position, inside of each motor omnibus in use, a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

20. These Bye-laws shall come into force on

the first day of July, 1907.
