MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Barge Walk, Hampton Court Park, Middlesex.

WHEREAS the First Commissioner of His Majesty's Works and Public Buildings has represented to the Local Government Board that a regulation should be made under Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, and Section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, for prohibiting the driving of motor cars upon the highway known as Barge Walk, situate between the River Thames and Hampton Court Park, in the county of Middlesex, and extending from Kingston Bridge to Hampton Court Bridge:
