Persons comprised in the classes (c), (d), (e) must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination, before the commencement of the competition.

Persons comprised in class (f) will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons comprised in class (g) will not be qualified for appointment until the consent of the Board of Inland Revenue, given with the like sanction, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

V. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

VI. A fee of 10s, will be required from every Candidate attending an examination.

Whereas by the twenty-first section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-Districts:—

- 1. And whereas it is expedient in the interest of public convenience that Llanfihangel Abergwessin and Llanddewi Abergwessin Civil Parishes should be transferred from Abergwessin Sub-District of Builth Registration District to Llanwrtyd Sub-District of the same Registration District.
- 2. Now therefore I, Sir William Cospatrick Dunbar, Bart., C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.
- 3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of June, nineteen hundred and seven.
