The Wild Birds Protection (County of Cambridge) Order, 1907.

Dated 18th May, 1907.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Cambridge, I hereby make the following Order:—

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Cambridge) Order, 1907."

BIRDS.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

II. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year, and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Cambridge:

Great Bustard, Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Owl (all species).

Eccs.

All Eggs protected within a certain Area.

III. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' Eggs is prohibited within that part of the County of Cambridge known as Wicken Sedge Fen for a period of three years from the date of this Order.

Repeal of former Order.

IV. The Order of the 17th November, 1905, is hereby repealed.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Kent) Order, 1907.

Dated 22nd May, 1907.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Kent, I hereby make the following Order :-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Kent) Order, 1907."

BIRDS.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

1II. During the period between the 1st day of September in any year and the 1st day of March following, the taking or killing of any of the following kinds of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Kent:—Bittern, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Cuckoo, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldonch, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Osprey, Owl (all species), Lesser Redpoll, Redstart, Robin, Shrikes, Spoonbill, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Longtailed Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Green Woodpecker, Great Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Wood-Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

All Birds protected on Sundays in certain Parishes.

IV. Extension of Close Time throughout the County.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall, except as regards the Common Wild Duck, be extended throughout the County of Kent,
