**LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.**

**Callington Light Railway (Amendment and Transfer) Order.**

The Light Railway Commissioners have submitted to the Board of Trade for confirmation, under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them authorizing the transfer to the Great Western Railway Company of the powers conferred on the Callington Light Railway Company by the Callington Light Railway Order, 1900, as amended by the Callington Light Railway (Extension of Time) Order, 1903, and reviving the powers granted and extending the period limited by the said Orders for the compulsory purchase of lands, and extending the period limited by the said Orders for the completion of the railway and works thereby authorized.

Any objections to the confirmation of the Order should be addressed to the Assistant Secretary (Railway Department), Board of Trade, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W., and must be lodged with the Board on or before the 15th June, 1907. The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated May 8th, from His Majesty's Representative at Stockholm enclosing a copy of Notices issued by the Royal Swedish Board of Trade, of which the following is a translation:—

In compliance with the Royal Order in Council of June 16th, 1905, the Board of Trade, upon official report, hereby declare King William Town in Cape Colony infected with Plague.

In accordance with the Notices previously issued the following places are considered as infected with Plague:—the Russian Government Astrachan, Egypt, Rio de Janeiro in Brazil, Peru, Antofagasta and Pisagua in Chile, the Provinces of Hedschas and Yemen in Arabia, the Ural and Transcaspian Districts in Asia, Afghanistan, the Ports of Schat-el-Arab, British East India, Rangoon in British Burma, Manila on Luzon, the Islands of Formosa and Hong Kong, Hanoi in Tonkin, the Ports of Newchwang, Foochow, and Amoy in China, Japan, Madagascar, King William Town in Cape Colony, Sydney, Perth, Fremantle, and Geraldton in Australia; and with Cholera:—the Ports of the Red Sea, the Ports of British East India, Cochinchina, Tonkin, China, Japan, and Morocco.

The station of observation and quarantine is, until further notice, located at Kånsö, near Gothenburg.
