

## THE COMPANIES ACTS, 1862 to 1900.

Whereas by section seventy-one of the Companies Act, 1862, the Board of Trade are empowered to make such alterations in the Forms contained in the Second Schedule to the said Act as they deem requisite;

Amendment to Quarantine Regulations for the  
Port of Newchwang, 1906.

1. The Quarantine Regulations for the Port of Newchwang, 1906, shall be amended as follows:—

In Regulations I and XIII, the words "Superintendent of Customs" shall be substituted for the word "Administration."

2. This Regulation may be cited as "The Quarantine Regulations for the Port of Newchwang Amendment Regulation, 1907."

## THE MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

County of Wilts.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903"), it is enacted that the Local Government Board may by regulations made

under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous:

Notice is hereby given, that the County Council of Wilts have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made under section 6 of the Act of 1896, and section 8 of the Act of 1903, for prohibiting the driving of motor cars upon the highway known as Crablane, in the rural district of Mere, within the county of Wilts:

Notice is hereby further given, that objections to the making of any such regulation may be sent in writing to the Local Government Board at their office, Whitehall, London, S.W., on or before the eighteenth day of June, 1907.

A copy of any such objection should be sent at the same time by the objector to the County Council, addressed to the Clerk to the County Council of Wilts, County Offices, Trowbridge.

And whereas the said Sidney Dominic Jerrold is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment to the office of District Auditor of the said Sidney Dominic Jerrold (hereinafter referred to as "the District Auditor"), and do Order and Prescribe as follows:—
