PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Petroleum Act, 1871, that His Majesty may, from time to time, make, revoke, and vary Orders in Council directing that the said Act, or any part thereof, shall apply to any substance, and that the said Act, or the part thereof specified in any such Order, shall, during the continuance of the Order, apply to such substance, and shall be construed and have effect as if such substance had been included in the definition of petroleum to which that Act applies, subject to the following qualifications:—

1. The quantity of any substance to which this Act is directed by Order in Council to apply which may be kept without a licence shall be such quantity only as is specified in that behalf in such Order, or if no such quantity is specified no quantity may be kept without a licence.

2. The label on the vessel containing such substances shall be such as may be specified in that behalf in the Order.

And whereas the Petroleum Act, 1879, and the Petroleum (Hawkers) Act, 1881, are to be construed as one with the Petroleum Act, 1871, and may, together with such Act, be cited as the Petroleum Acts, 1871 to 1881.

And whereas mixtures of petroleum with other substances present dangers similar to those presented by petroleum without admixture.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the above-mentioned provisions of the Petroleum Act, 1871, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and prescribe that the undermentioned parts of the Petroleum Acts, 1871 to 1881, shall apply to any mixture of petroleum with any other substance which, when tested in the manner set forth in the schedule to

this Order, gives off an inflammable vapour at a temperature of less than seventy-three degrees of Fahrenheit's thermometer; whether such mixture be liquid, viscous, or solid, in the same manner as if such mixture were petroleum to which the said Acts apply, viz.:—

The whole of the Petroleum Acts, 1871 to 1881, except:—

(a) So much of section 6 of the Petroleum Act, 1871, as specifies the nature of the label to be on the vessel, in lieu of which the label shall be as hereinafter provided.

(b) So much of section 7 of the Petroleum Act, 1871, relating to the exemption from such section of small quantities under certain specified conditions, as is inconsistent with or contradictory to the exemptions and conditions hereinafter prescribed.

(c) So much of section 11 of the Petroleum Act, 1871, and of the Petroleum Act, 1879, relating to the testing of petroleum, as is inconsistent with or contradictory to the directions for testing contained in the schedule to this Order.

The label on the vessel or package containing a petroleum mixture which is subject to the Petroleum Acts in virtue of this Order shall bear in conspicuous characters the name of the mixture and the words "Petroleum Mixture giving off an inflammable heavy vapour." "Not to be exposed near a flame."

The quantity of any petroleum mixture which is subject to the Petroleum Acts in virtue of this Order, which may be kept without licence, and the conditions of such keeping, shall be as follows:—

(a) Where the petroleum mixture is sufficiently liquid to be measured by liquid measure, the quantity and the conditions of keeping shall be those specified in section 7 of the Petroleum Act, 1871.

(b) Where the petroleum mixture is solid, or otherwise unsuitable to be measured by liquid

measure, the quantity which may be kept without licence shall not exceed thirty pounds, which may only be so kept provided that it is enclosed in hermetically sealed packages or vessels containing each not more than one pound.

Wherever in the Petroleum Acts, 1871 to 1881, or in any Order, byelaw, or licence issued under these Acts, a quantity is specified in gallons or pints, such quantity shall, in the case of such solid petroleum mixture, be read as though the weight of ten pounds were substituted for a gallon and of one pound for a pint.

SCHEDULE.

Directions for Testing Petroleum Mixtures.

1. Liquid Mixtures.

Where the petroleum mixture is wholly liquid, flows quite freely, and does not contain any sediment or thickening ingredient, such mixture shall be tested in the manner set forth in schedule one to the Petroleum Act, 1879.

2. Viscous and Sedimentary Mixtures.

Where the petroleum mixture contains an undissolved sediment, as in the case of some metal polishes, which can be separated by filtration or by settlement and decantation, the sediment may be so separated and the decanted liquid may be tested in the manner set forth in schedule one to the Petroleum Act, 1879.

In carrying out such separation, care must be taken to minimize the evaporation of the petroleum. The separation of the sediment must not be effected by distillation.

Where the petroleum mixture is such that sediment cannot be separated by the afore-mentioned means, or where it is of a viscous nature, as in the case of indiarubber solution, quick-drying paints, &c., such mixture shall be tested in the apparatus modified as shewn in the drawing hereto. This apparatus differs from that prescribed in schedule one to the Petroleum Act, 1879, only in the addition of a stirrer to equalize the temperature throughout the sample under test.

In carrying out the test of a viscous petroleum mixture, this stirrer shall be constantly revolved at a slow speed, except when applying the test flame, with the fingers, the direction of revolution being that of the hand of a clock.

With the exception of the use of the stirrer, the manner of carrying out the test shall be that set forth in schedule one to the Petroleum Act, 1879.

The stirrer may be removed by grasping the spindle just above the blades with the finger and thumb, and unscrewing the upper sheath. The opening in the lid, through which the stirrer passes, may then be closed by a plug provided for the purpose.

When this has been done, the apparatus shall be deemed to comply with the specification set forth in schedule one of the Petroleum Act, 1879, and may be used for testing ordinary petroleum or solid petroleum mixtures.

A model of the aforementioned apparatus will be deposited with the Board of Trade, and the

provisions of section three of the Petroleum Act, 1879, in regard to verification and stamping shall apply also to such apparatus as though it were the apparatus prescribed by the said Act.

For the purpose of carrying out such verification the stirrer shall be removed and the opening plugged as hereinbefore directed. The apparatus shall then be tested with ordinary petroleum. The stirrer shall be verified by comparison of measurements.

3. Solid Petroleum Mixtures.

Where the petroleum mixture is solid, as in the case of naphtha soaps, etc., the apparatus to be used for the test shall be that prescribed in schedule one of the Petroleum Act, 1879.

The method of carrying out the test of such solid mixture shall be as follows:—

The solid mixture must be cut into cylinders one and a half inches long and one quarter inch in diameter by means of a cork borer or other cylindrical cutter having the correct internal diameter. These cylinders are to be placed in the petroleum cup of the testing apparatus in a vertical position in such number as will completely fill the cup. The cylinders must be in contact with one another, but must not be so tightly packed as to be deformed in shape.

Five or six of the cylinders in the centre of the cup must be shortened to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch to allow space for the thermometer bulb.

The air bath of the testing apparatus must be filled to a depth of $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches with water. The water bath must then be raised to and maintained at a temperature of about 75° Fahrenheit.

The cup must then be placed in the air bath, and the temperature of the sample must be allowed to rise until the thermometer in the oil cup shews 72° Fahrenheit, when the test flame must be applied.

If no flash is obtained, this temperature must be maintained constant in the oil cup for one hour, at the expiration of which time the test flame must again be applied.

If a flash is obtained, the solid mixture will be subject to the provisions of the Petroleum Acts in virtue of this Order.

NOTE.—It may in many cases save time in testing samples of petroleum mixtures to apply the test flame after the sample has been a few minutes in the cup and while still at the temperature of the room in which the test is being carried out, provided that this temperature is below 73° Fahrenheit. If a flash is obtained by this means, it is unnecessary to proceed with the test at a higher temperature.

**TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY
BILLS.**

1. The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Restrictions and alteration of limits of Scheduled Area.

1. The limits of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by Order of the Board dated the fourth day of May, nineteen hundred and seven, are hereby contracted so as to comprise only the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall in their application to the Infected Area thus described be modified in manner declared by this Order.

Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

2.—(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition of swine in the Infected Area if they are satisfied that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and thereupon the market fair sale or exhibition may be held accordingly.

(2.) A Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fairs sales or exhibitions on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time or revoked at any time by the Local Authority.

(3.) A Licence shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same, and a copy of the Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition where such market fair sale or exhibition is held.

(4.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article.

(5.) A fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority and named in the Licence for the purpose of receiving Licences authorising movement of swine to the market fair sale or exhibition, and for granting Licences for movement of swine

therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(6.) No swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare into a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Article unless accompanied by a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order.

Licences for Movement out of Licensed Markets, &c.

3.—(1.) Swine exposed at a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order may be moved from the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in an Infected Area if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement—in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the market fair sale or exhibition is held.

(2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.

(3.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where the place of destination specified in the Licence is in an Infected Area, the swine shall be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

4.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to a market fair sale or exhibition in an Infected Area, the Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition by the person in charge of the swine to the person appointed under this Order to receive the same.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to any other premises in an Infected Area, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

Attendance at Markets, &c.

5. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order.

Revocation by Board of Licences.

6. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

9.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“Infected Area” means an area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of June, nineteen hundred and seven.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
