ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 24TH JUNE 1907.)

WILTSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Wiltshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906.

1. Part II (*Restriction on Movement of Swine within Scheduled Area*) of the Wiltshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906, hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order," is hereby modified in the manner hereinafter contained.

Declaration for Movement of Swine for Breeding Purposes.

2. In the case of swine moved for breeding purposes from any premises in the Scheduled Area to which the principal Order applies, a period of fourteen days may be inserted in the declaration required by the principal Order instead of twenty-eight days.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of June, nineteen hundred and seven.

Short Title and Construction.

4. This Order may be cited as the WILTSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1907, and shall be read as one with the principal Order.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 24TH JUNE 1907.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Burton-upon-Trent (Swine-Fever) Order of 1905 shall not apply to the movement of swine to or from the exhibition intended to be held by the Staffordshire Agricultural Society at Branstone, near Burton-upon-Trent, on the 17th and 18th days of July, 1907, if the swine are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent, which licence is hereby authorised to be granted.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or of any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved from the said exhibition to any place of destination in Great Britain situate in any scheduled area, if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate, which licence is hereby authorised to be granted.

3. The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to any place of destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere, and while being so moved shall not be subject to Regulations made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever.
