

of Kew-road aforesaid to a point near Hatherley-road thence in a westerly direction across Kew Gardens still following the said Kew parish boundary across the lake to a point where the same meets the municipal borough boundary in the river, and thence in a south-westerly and southerly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid at the said railway bridge.

No. 2.—West Ward.

And I do hereby determine that West Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point on the municipal borough boundary at the said railway bridge over the River Thames, and running thence along part of the southern boundary of North Ward as hereinbefore described along the centre of the said railway, along the Old Deer Park wall and along the centre of the said private road and Clarence-street to the point in the centre of Kew-road aforesaid, thence intersecting Kew-road and running in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Church-road over the railway and continuing to a point where Church-road meets the Vineyard, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of the Vineyard to a point in Hill Rise opposite Compass-hill and along the centre of Compass-hill to Petersham-road, thence in a straight line across the Petersham-road to the municipal borough boundary in the River Thames, thence in a north-westerly direction following the said municipal borough boundary in the river past Richmond Bridge and Corporation Island to the point of commencement aforesaid at the said railway bridge.

No. 3.—East Ward.

And I do hereby determine that East Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point in Kew-road opposite Clarence-street thence following part of the southern boundary of North Ward as hereinbefore described along the centre of Kew-road and Lower Mortlake-road to the aforesaid point where the same passes over the centre of the London and South Western Railway from Richmond to Kensington, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Manor-road intersecting the London and South-Western Railway (Windsor Line) thence continuing along the centre of Manor-road in a southerly direction intersecting Sheen-road to a point on the south side of Sheen-road opposite the centre of Manor-road, thence in a south-westerly direction to the centre of Queen's-road near the Black Horse Inn, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Queen's-road to the point where an ancient boundary crosses the said road at the southern end of Pest House Common, thence along the said ancient boundary in a westerly direction intersecting Denbigh Gardens and along the southern wall of the garden of Holy Trinity Vicarage to a point in King's-road opposite Audley-road, thence along the centre of Audley-road and Albert-road, crossing Albany Passage still following the said ancient boundary along the centre of Preston Place to the centre of Church-road opposite the Vineyard, thence along the centre of Church-road in a north-westerly direction following the eastern boundary of West Ward as hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid in Kew-road.

No. 4.—South Ward.

And I do hereby determine that South Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point on the municipal borough boundary

in the River Thames where the southern boundary of West Ward meets the same, thence following the said southern boundary of West Ward intersecting Hill Rise along the centre of the Vineyard and continuing along the ancient boundary forming the southern boundary of East Ward as hereinbefore described to the aforesaid point where the same crosses the centre of Queen's-road at the southern end of Pest House Common, thence along the centre of Queen's-road in a northerly direction following the eastern boundary of East Ward as hereinbefore described to the aforesaid point on the south side of Sheen-road opposite the centre of Manor-road, thence leaving the eastern boundary of East Ward and continuing along the south side of Sheen-road to the point where it meets the municipal borough boundary, thence following the said municipal borough boundary in a southerly and westerly direction to and through Richmond Park and Sudbrook Park, across Petersham-road and thence still following the municipal borough boundary to a point in the River Thames near Ham House, thence following the said municipal borough boundary in the River Thames to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 5.—North Sheen Ward.

And I do hereby determine that North Sheen Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point where the Lower Mortlake-road passes over the centre of the London and South Western Railway from Richmond to Kensington, thence following the centre of that railway in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of North Ward as hereinbefore described to the aforesaid point where the Kew parish boundary intersects the said railway, thence following the said Kew parish boundary in a south-easterly direction till the same meets the municipal borough boundary, thence following the said municipal borough boundary in a westerly and southerly direction past Gipsy Corner along the eastern side of Mortlake-road, to the Lower Richmond-road, thence along the northern side of Lower Richmond-road in a westerly direction till the said municipal borough boundary crosses the said road, thence following the said boundary in a southerly direction and intersecting the London and South Western Railway (Windsor Line) past King's Farm Lodge to the south side of Sheen-road, thence still following the said boundary in a south-westerly direction to the point where the same leaves the Sheen-road and turns to the south, thence continuing along the south side of Sheen-road to the aforesaid point in the same opposite the centre of Manor-road, thence along the centre of Manor-road in a northerly direction intersecting the London and South Western Railway (Windsor Line) and following the eastern boundary of East Ward to the point of commencement aforesaid, where the Lower Richmond-road passes over the centre of the London and South Western Railway from Richmond to Kensington.

No. 6.—Kew Ward.

And I do hereby determine that Kew Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is contained within the old parish boundaries of Kew, that is to say:—Within a line commencing at the aforesaid point in the River Thames where the northern boundary of North Ward meets the municipal borough boundary, thence following the said municipal and parish boundary in the River Thames in a north-easterly direction intersecting King Edward VIIth. Bridge, and in a
