### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 4TH JULY 1907.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Article 6 (2) of the Sheep-Dipping (England) Order of 1907, which restricts the movement of sheep until they have been dipped, shall not apply in the case of movement of sheep from any premises in the administrative county of Somerset or the county borough of Bath, for the purpose of exposure in a market, fair-ground or saleyard, if the movement of the sheep from those premises is authorised by a licence which may be granted by an

Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which those premises are situate.

2. The licence shall state the market, fair-ground or saleyard at which the sheep are to be exposed, and shall be granted only if the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fair-ground or saleyard is situate have consented to the issue of such a licence, either generally or in the particular instance.
