ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 9TH JULY 1907.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by
virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in
them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894
to 1903, and of every other power enabling them
in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered,
as follows :

1. Article 6 (2) of the Sheep-Dipping (England)
Order of 1907, which restricts the movement of
sheep until they have been dipped, shall not
apply in the case of movement of sheep from
any premises in the administrative county of
East Sussex, or the county boroughs of Brighton
or Hastings, for the purpose of exposure in a
market, fair-ground or saleyard, if the movement
of the sheep from those premises is authorised by
a licence which may be granted by an Inspector
of the Local Authority of the District in which
those premises are situate.

2. The licence shall state the market, fair-
ground or saleyard at which the sheep are to be
exposed, and shall be granted only if the Local
Authority of the District in which the market,
fair-ground or saleyard is situate have consented
to the issue of such a licence, either generally
or in the particular instance.

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

as follows :

Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to
this Order is hereby declared to be an area
infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the
Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the
seventeenth day of July, nineteen hundred and
seven.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 10TH JULY 1907.)

INVERNESS-SHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS)
ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by
virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in
them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894
to 1903, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other
power enabling them in this behalf, do order,
and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of either of the
Districts specified in the Schedule to this Order
may, in accordance with the provisions of this
Order, make Regulations, with a view to the pre-
vention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for
requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall,
during all or any of the hours between sunset
and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under
control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole
or any part of the District, and may exempt any
class of dogs either generally or under prescribed
conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order
shall not take effect unless and until they have
been submitted to and confirmed by the Board
of Agriculture and Fisheries.
