#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the thirtieth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of North Willingham, in the county of Lincoln, and in the diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas the late Henry Robert Boucherett, of North Willingham aforesaid, by his will, dated the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, gave and devised (inter alia) the said advowson, subject, as therein mentioned, to certain uses which have since determined, or failed to take effect, and ultimately (so far as material to these presents) to the use of each of the sons born during the testator's lifetime of Frederick St. John Newdigate Barne for the life of such son without impeachment of waste and after his decease to the use of his first and other sons successively in tail general.

"And whereas the said testator died on the eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

"And whereas Captain Miles Barne, of Sotterley Hall, Wangford, in the county of Suffolk, the eldest son of the said Frederick St. John Newdigate Barne, was born on the fifteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and Lieutenant Michael Barne, R.N., of Hill House, Belstead, near Ipswich, in the said county of Suffolk, the second son of the said Frederick St. John Newdigate Barne, was born on the fifteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

"And whereas the said advowson is, together with other hereditaments, subject, in priority to the limitations above mentioned, to a mortgage in fee simple in favour of Charles Henry Fehler Christie, of Ongar, in the county of Essex, Esquire, and Daniel Conner Lathbury, of No. 5, Sydney-place, in the county of London, Esquire.

"And whereas the said Miles Barne and Michael Barne are desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of North Willingham should be transferred to and be

vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Lincoln.

"And whereas the said Charles Henry Fehler Christie and Daniel Conner Lathbury have agreed to concur in such transfer for the purpose of enabling the said advowson to be vested in the said Bishop free from their said mortgage security.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward, now Bishop of Lincoln, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Edward, Bishop of Lincoln, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of North Willingham, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of North Willingham.

"Now therefore with the consent and approval of the said Miles Barne, Michael Barne, Charles Henry Fehler Christie, and Daniel Conner Lathbury (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme), and with the consent of the said Edward, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of North Willingham shall be transferred to the said Edward, Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edward, Bishop of Lincoln, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lincoln,

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the forty-seventh and forty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the thirteenth day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for Eugland, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the forty-seventh and forty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, and of the district of Saint Michael, Chiswick, both in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-sixth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-ninth day of the same month a certain part of the parish of Chiswick, in the said county of Middlesex and in the said diocese of London, was assigned as a chapelry district to the consecrated church called Christ Church, situate at Turnham Green, in the said parish of Chiswick, and the said chapelry district was named 'The Chapelry District of Christ Church, Turnham Green.'

"And whereas the said chapelry district of Christ Church, Turnham Green, has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-eighth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and six, and published in the London Gazette on the thirty-first day of the same month, certain portions of the said parish of Chiswick and of the said new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, were constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and such district was named 'The District of Saint Michael, Chiswick.'

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Christ

Church, Turnham Green, and of the said district junction with the road called Harvard hill, and of Saint Michael, Chiswick, shall be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

| Extending the road called Harvard hill of the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, and of the said district of Saint Michael, Chiswick, shall be altered so that (firstly) all that portion of the said new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, which is described in the first schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said district of Saint Michael, Chiswick, and (secondly) all that portion of the said district of Saint Michael, Chiswick, which is described in the second schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such district and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, and (thirdly) all that portion of the said new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, which is described in the third schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured violet shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be restored to and shall in future form part of the said parish of Chiswick.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference:—

## "THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, and to be annexed to the district of Saint Michael, Chiswick, in the same county and diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, which is bounded upon the west by the new parish of Saint James, Gunnersbury, upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint Paul, Grove Park, Chiswick, both in the said county and diocese, upon the south-east and upon the east by the said district of Saint Michael, Chiswick, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the boundary which divides the said district of Saint Michael, Chiswick, from the said new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, at the junction of Little Sutton-lane with Dead Donkey-lane, and extending theuce westward along the middle of Dead Donkey-lane for a distance of twelve chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its

extending thence southward along the middle of Harvard-hill for a distance of four chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Wolseley-gardens, and extending thence westward along the middle of Wolseley-gardens for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Whitehall Park-gardens, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line to the angle formed by the northern side of Wolseley-gardens and the western side of Whitehall Park-gardens, and extending thence westward in a straight line in continuation of the northern side of Wolseleygardens for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Kensington and Richmond Branch Line of the London and South Western Railway upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, from the said new parish of Saint James, Gunnersbury.

# "THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said district of Saint Michael, Chiswick, and to be annexed to the said new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, being:—

"All that portion of the said district of int Michael, Chiswick, which is bounded upon the north by the said new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, upon the south-east partly by the last named new parish and partly by the parish of Chiswick, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Chiswick from the said district of Saint Michael, Chiswick, at the junction of Park-road with Ellesmere-road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Ellesmere-road for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sutton Court-road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Sutton Court-road for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with Barrowgate-road upon the boundary which divides the said district of Saint Michael, Chiswick, from the said new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green.

# "THE THIRD SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, and to be restored to the said parish of Chiswick, being:—

"All that triangular portion of the said new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, which is situate to the south-east of Park-road and to the south-west of Duke's-avenue, and is bounded upon all sides as follows, viz.:—Upon the northwest by the above described portion of the said district of Saint Michael, Chiswick, upon the north-east by the new parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Chiswick, in the said county and diocese, and upon the south by the said parish of Chiswick."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the three cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and the Patrons of the said three cures and the Incumbents of the said parish of Chiswick and of the said district of Saint Michael, Chiswick, have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas one calendar month has expired since the date of the transmission of such drafts as aforesaid.

And whereas the Incumbent of the said new parish of Christ Church, Turnham Green, has offered certain objections to the same scheme.

And whereas, notwithstanding these objections, the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District (Supplemental):-

# NORTH-EASTERN COUNTIES AUDIT DISTRICT.

To Henry Ward Oliver, Barrister-at-Law, District Auditor;—

the Yorkshire Inebriates Act Joint Committee ;--

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 13th day of July, 1906, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of Henry Ward Oliver as a District Auditor, and assigned to him the duties therein mentioned and the District in which he should act as Auditor, and which in the said Order was termed "The North Eastern Counties Audit District";

And whereas the Councils of the North, East, and West Ridings of Yorkshire, of the cities of Bradford and of Leeds, of the cities and counties of Kingston-upon-Hull and of York, and of the borough of Halifax have joined in appointing out of their respective bodies a Joint Committee for the purposes of the Inebriates Acts, 1879 to 1900;

whereas the Joint Committee appointed is known as the Yorkshire Inebriates Act Joint Committee and is an Authority whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and it is desirable that the duty of auditing the Accounts of the said Joint Committee and of their Officers be assigned to the said Henry Ward Oliver;

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise Prescribe, be the duty of the said Henry Ward Oliver to audit the Accounts of the said Joint Committee, and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article II of the above-cited Order; and that for the purpose of such Audit the area within which the powers, authorities, and jurisdiction of the Joint Committee may be exercised shall be deemed to be within the said North-Eastern Counties Audit District.

  - Accountancy (including Book-keeping by Double Entry).
  - 4. Political Economy.

Not more than two may be taken.

8. German, Translation and Composition

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9. Geography and English History.

 Geometry, the substance of Euclid, Books I.—IV., and VI; and Algebra up to and including the Binomial Theorem.

- 3. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 18TH JULY 1907.)

GLOUCESTERSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS)
ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

# Power to make Regulations.

- 1.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.
- (2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

#### Confirmation of Regulations.

- 2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—
  - (i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.
  - (ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.
  - (iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.
- (3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made

under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

# Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

6. This Order may be cited as the GLOUCESTER-SHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1907.

By day.—A red flag hoisted at the yard opposite the channel of the signal mast on the West Jetty, and also at Leugenaer Tower.

By night.—A red light at the same places.

2. Departure from the port and all movement of vessels within it is prohibited when the following signals, which indicate a vessel entering, are made:—

By day.—A green flag hoisted at the inner

end of the Trystram and l'Ouest Locks, and also at Leugenaer Tower.

By night.—A green light hoisted at the same places.

3. Entry into or departure from the port is prohibited when the following signals are made:—

By day.—A red flag hoisted on the yard opposite the channel of the signal mast on the West Jetty, and a green flag on the mast below the tide signal flags, and at Leugenaer Tower a red flag over a green flag.

By night.—Two red lights over a green light at the same places.

The day and night signals given above (2), prohibiting departure, will be hoisted at the same time at the inner of Trystram and l'Ouest Locks.

A green flag hoisted on the yard opposite the channel of the tidal signal mast on the West Jetty by day, or a green light by night, indicates that torpedo boats or tugs may enter at their own risk, although entry for other vessels is prohibited.

- 4. When vessels are prohibited from entering Trystram Lock the following signals will be made:—
- a. When entry is temporarily prohibited. By day.—A red, white, and blue flag (letter T of the code signals) will be hoisted on the yard opposite the channel on the signal mast of the West Jetty. By night.—A white light hoisted in the same place.
- b. When entry is indefinitely prohibited. By day.—A red, white, and blue flag (T), and a blue and white pennant (D of the code signals) will be hoisted on the yard opposite the channel of the signal mast on the West Jetty. By night.—Two white lights hoisted in the same place.
- 5. If any vessels or boats are in the Avant Port, Channel, or Port d'Échouage when the signals given in (1) and (2) are made, they must for the moment place themselves alongside the nearest accessible quay or jetty.
- 6. The above signals will remain in force as long as circumstances render them necessary.

The captains, masters, or owners of vessels must conform to the information given to them by the signals, without prejudice to any action which may be necessary to take against the pilots, in case of infraction. These signals are always to be considered as equivalent to an express and individual order given by the Captain of the port.

7. Fishing and all other vessels are prohibited from beating in or out of the port.

Wusung River Bar—Regulations for Crossing.

Information has been received through the Board of Trade, that, in order to prevent accidents to vessels crossing the inner and outer bars of the Wusung River, the following regulations were put into force July, 1906, and must be strictly adhered to by Mariners:

- 1. A careful look-out is to be kept on approaching the Wusung bars, by inward-bound vessels when about a mile below the outer bar, and by outward-bound vessels when abreast of the southern end of Gough Island:-
- a. Vessels having the tide against them must wait for vessels having a fair tide.
- b. Overtaking vessels must regulate their speed to allow overtaken vessels to clear the bars first.
- 2. Captains and pilots are not to attempt to cross either bar when the signals at Wusung indicate less water than their vessels are drawing. Sometimes, however, a greater depth can be obtained by not following the bar leading marks. Captains and pilots desiring to avail themselves of this information should apply to the Harbour Master's Office at Shanghai, or to the Berthing Officer at Wusung, shortly before they wish to cross the bar.
- 3. Vessels anchoring outside Wusung must take up a berth well clear of leading marks over the outer bar in order to avoid all risk of collision with vessels crossing the bar.
