Application of the Order.

1. This Order shall apply to the administrative counties of the Isle of Ely, Lincoln (Parts of Holland) and Norfolk.

Definitions.

- 2. In this Order-
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "The Local Authority" means as regards any District described in the first column of the schedule hereto, the council mentioned in the second column of that schedule:
- "Disease" means the disease affecting goose-berry and current bushes which is known as Sphaerotheca mors uvae, or American gooseberry mildew; and "diseased" means affected with disease:
- "Bush" includes a cutting, seedling, or other plant.

Notification of Disease.

- 3.—(1.) The occupier of any premises on which there is a bush which is diseased or suspected of being diseased shall forthwith notify the fact to the clerk to the Local Authority, or to some person authorised by the Local Authority to receive such notices, and where practicable a specimen showing the disease or suspected disease shall accompany the notice.
- (2.) If any person knowingly fail to give a notice required by this Order to be given by him he shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Measures for Prevention of the Spread of Disease.

- 4.-(1.) The Local Authority on receiving in any manner notice of the existence or supposed existence of disease shall take such steps as may be necessary to determine whether the disease exists, and the area covered by diseased bushes, or by bushes to which the disease is likely to spread, and shall cause a notice to be served on the occupier of any land within that area requiring him to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the disease as are authorised by this Article.
 - (2.) A notice under this Article shall require-
 - (i.) the immediate destruction by burning or other effective method of all diseased bushes, including the fruit on such bushes;
 - (ii.) the thorough spraying as soon as possible with a solution of copper sulphate (con-

- to a gallon of water) or with some other fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Local Authority for that purpose of the site of any bush that has been destroyed;
- (iii.) the thorough spraying of all gooseberry and current bushes on the area defined in the notice with a fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Local Authority for that purpose and so that the spraying shall be carried out at such time or times as an inspector of the Local Authority shall direct and to his satisfaction;
- (iv.) that no gooseberry or currant bush or any part of any such bush shall be removed or permitted to be removed out of the area defined in the notice except with, and subject to the conditions (if any) of, a licence authorising such removal, but this restriction shall not apply to fruit of a bush that is not diseased.
- (3.) Any notice may be altered or withdrawn by the Local Authority if and when they are satisfied that this may be done without risk of the spread of disease.
- (4.) If any person fail to adopt any measure for prevention of the spread of the disease required by a notice served on him under this Article he shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Returns of Proceedings.

5. The Local Authority shall in a form to be provided by the Board notify the Board of any outbreak of disease, and shall as soon as may be after the expiration of each year report to the Board the proceedings taken by the Local Anthority under this Order in the preceding

Powers of Entry.

6. Any inspector or other officer appointed in that behalf by the Local Authority, and any inspector of the Board, may upon production if so required of his appointment or authority enter any land on which he has reason to believe that disease exists or has recently existed and examine any gooseberry or currant bush on such land and any person who wilfully obstructs or impedes any inspector or other officer in the course of his duties under this Order shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

7. This Order shall be published by the Local Authority by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district of the Local Authority or in such other manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to insure publicity for the

 - (2.) the swine must not within the Area be removed from the float van or cart, or be permitted to come in contact with other swine.
 - (3.) The swine must be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

Provision as to Local Regulations.

3. The powers of the Local Authority of the county of Gloucester to make regulations under the Swine-Fever Order of 1894, as to movement, exposure, or sale of swine, shall, as regards the part of the county included in the extended Area, be suspended during the operation of this Order, and all such regulations in force at the commencement of this Order shall thereupon cease to operate in that part of the county.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of July, nineteen hundred and seven.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. Article 6 (2) of the Sheep-Dipping (England) Order of 1907, which restricts the movement of sheep until they have been dipped, shall not apply in the case of movement of sheep from any premises in the administrative county of Wilts for the purpose of exposure in a market, fair-ground or saleyard, if the movement of the sheep from those premises is authorised by a licence which may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which those premises are situate.
- 2. The licence shall state the market, fairground or saleyard at which the sheep are to be exposed, and shall be granted only if the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fair-ground or saleyard is situate have consented to the issue of such a licence, either generally or in the particular instance.

No. 999.—ENGLAND, SOUTH COAST— SOLENT AND SPITHEAD.

Regulations in Connection with the Assembly of the Home Fleet in August, 1907.

The Naval Commander-in-Chief at Portsmouth has, on behalf of the Admiralty, issued the following regulations to be observed by all vessels navigating the Solent and Spithead on the occasion of the assemby of the Home Fleet between the 30th day of July, 1907, and the 6th day of August, 1907.

1. In order to reduce as far as possible the chances of collision, directors of steamship companies, owners of steam-vessels, yachts, &c., are earnestly requested to give directions to the Masters of their ships to follow closely the instructions herein laid down, and to pay implicit attention to the requests of the officers in charge of the patrol tugs and steamboats, who will be specially charged with the duty of keeping clear the anchorage ground.

Vessels disobeying these directions are liable to be removed from the anchorage ground, and the Masters proceeded against summarily.

- 2. The patrol vessels will carry a white ensign on a staff at the stern, and a red flag on a staff in the bows, to enable them to be readily distinguished from other vessels.
- 3. The fleet will be anchored to the southward of the Bramble Bank, and the space to be kept clear is that enclosed within a distance of 2 cables (400 yards) from any of the ships of war at anchor.
- 4. In the crowded condition of the fairways between the Isle of Wight and the mainland, navigation must be conducted with the greatest caution, and sailing-vessels and small craft must remember that large steam-vessels will not always be able to give way to them.
- 5. Vessels are particularly cautioned against approaching close to squadrons of ships of war which may be under way, the fact that they are of heavy draught and manœuvring in pilotage

water in close order, renders it impossible for them to give way to individual vessels. Masters of sailing vessels, yachts, and small boats must remember that the wash in the wake of the large ships of war may cause sailing vessels to miss stays and become unmanageable.

- 6. All steam vessels in the vicinity of the Fleet are requested to burn Welsh coal, so that the smoke may not obstruct the view of the Fleet nor cause danger of collision. Vessels neglecting this rule will be removed to a distance.
- 7. Private steam vessels, steam yachts, and sailing vessels are permitted to pass between the columns under the following regulations, except on Saturday, 3rd August, between 1.0 P.M. and 4.0 P.M.

(See plan of the position of the Fleet, published by the Admiralty, to be had of all sellers of Admiralty Charts.)

- a. For the purpose of these regulations the term "steam vessel" shall be held to include any vessel propelled by a motive power other than oars or sails.
- b. The course of vessels between the different columns of ships of war is to be as follows:—

Vessels proceeding to the eastward shall pass between the battleship line and the first-class cruisers, the latter forming the southern line of big ships.

Vessels bound to the westward shall pass between the battleship line and the second-class cruiser line, the latter forming the northern line of big ships.

Vessels are recommended to use the channel to the southward of the Ryde Middle whether bound to the eastward or to the westward. All vessels should avoid the destroyer's anchorage to the eastward of the Bramble bank, as the space between each of these vessels is very small.

Vessels must adhere to the rule of the road, i.e., keeping to their own starboard side of the channel.

- c. The number of ships anchored between the Ryde Middle and the Bramble bank will render it difficult for ships to navigate this channel at night, and they should use the channel between the Ryde Middle and the Isle of Wight. It will be difficult for large mail steamers to pass to and from Southampton by the eastern route on the nights between 30th July and 6th August, and the Needles channel should be used in consequence.
- d. At any time after sunset on the night of the 3rd of August, 1907, the ships of war may be illuminated, and search lights may be used, rendering it difficult for vessels to distinguish lights, buoys, and navigation marks.
- (e) While the ships of war are illuminated, vessels of over 200 feet long will not be permitted to pass between the columns.
- (t) The speed of steam vessels, when within the columns, is to be limited to 7 knots. Neglect of this rule, especially by paddle steamers, causes danger to small boats, which may result in loss of life. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- (g) While between the columns no vessels are to overtake and pass one another, and no vessel is to stop unless to avoid collision.
- (h) Should circumstances render it undesirable that vessels should pass between the columns, the ships of war at each end of the space which

is closed to traffic will hoist a blue ensign where it can best be seen, which will indicate that no ship is to pass between these columns; any such ship must then pass south of the Ryde Middle. Should the ships of war be dressed, the blue ensign will take the place of one of the ensigns ordinarily displayed.

8. All vessels are to make use of the sound signals mentioned in clause 28 of the Regulations for the Prevention of Collision at Sea when altering course or stopping, viz.:—

When altering course to starboard, one short blast.

When altering course to port, two short blasts.

- •When engines are going astern, three short blasts.
- 9. During the time that His Majesty the King is passing through the Fleet, no vessel of any kind will be permitted to cross the lines of the ships of war, nor pass between the columns, nor follow the procession of Royal yachts.
- 10. Any vessel at anchor in such a position as to obstruct the fairways, or interfere with the navigation of the ships of war from the anchorage ground to Spithead, will be requested to weigh, and if necessary, will be removed.
- 11. Unless she should be disabled, no vessel will be permitted to anchor in the fairway of the channel between the Ryde Middle and the Isle of Wight between noon on the 30th of July, 1907, and 6.0 P.M. on the 6th August, 1907.
- 12. Masters of vessels are cautioned that for some time before the dates mentioned lines of buoys will be laid to mark the positions of ships' berths. These buoys should be carefully avoided, as they are liable to injure small vessels coming into contact with them, and might cause injury to the floats of paddle vessels.
- 13. Sailing yachts actually competing in the various yacht races of the Royal Yacht Squadron and the Royal London Yacht Club will not be required to observe the regulations laid down for vessels passing between the columns of the Fleets. They will be free to pass in any direction between the ships of war.

To lessen the chances of collision, lookout men will be stationed in the ships of war to warn vessels passing up or down between the columns when yachts are about to cross their course. Vessels passing between the columns must be prepared for yachts coming from behind the ships of war and crossing their course, they must stop or stop and go astern if hailed to do so by megaphone from the ships of war.

Note.—Nothing in this notice is to be construed as absolving vessels from closely observing the provisions of the Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea.
