The following Addresses were presented to Their Majesties The King and Queen on Their arrival at Holyhead on the afternoon of July 8th, accompanied by Her Royal Highness the Princess Victoria:—

To His Most Excellent Majesty The King, and Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Alexandra.

We, the County Council of Anglesey, desire to approach Your Majesties with the affectionate greetings and the heartiest welcome of dutiful and loyal subjects on the visit of Your Majesties and Her Royal Highness The Princess Victoria to this county.

We have an abiding grateful sense of the abundant benefits and privileges that we enjoy with all who are the subjects of Your Majesty's world-wide dominions.

We hail and honour our King as an Ambassador of Peace, and as foremost in his desire and efforts to extend the blessings of peace to all nations of the world.

We are proud to attribute in no small degree to Your Majesty's benign influence the tranquillity prevailing generally in every quarter of the globe.

We earnestly pray that Your Majesty's reign may be prolonged and attended with progress and prosperity to Your Empire, and that Providence may accord to Your Majesty and to Queen Alexandra and to Her Royal Highness The Princess Victoria many many years of health and happiness.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I thank you on behalf of the Queen and Myself for the loyal and dutiful address which you have presented to Me from the Anglesey Council. The Princess Victoria is very glad to accompany Us on this occasion.

My former connection with the Principality as Prince of Wales adds to the pleasure of My'visit, and you may rest assured that I shall always be glad to hear of your prosperity.

It is most gratifying to Me to learn that your Council appreciates My efforts in the cause of peace. The prosperity of our country, which is so dear to My heart, could not but be imperilled by any disturbance of the tranquillity which now so happily prevails in Europe. The high position held by Great Britain among nations will, I hope, always be maintained by peaceful means. As far as in Me lies her influence will ever be devoted to the promotion of friendship and good feelings.

To Their Most Excellent Majesties King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra.

We, the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, and Members of the Holyhead Urban District Council most humbly and respectfully desire, both on our own behalf and that of the Inhabitants of the town of Holyhead, to tender to Your Majesties the expression of our loyal and dutiful attachment to Your Majesties and our heartfelt welcome on this, Your first visit to North Wales after Your Coronation.

We, in this town, in common with Your Majesties' subjects throughout Your world-wide dominions, rejoice in the peace and prosperity which the Empire has enjoyed since Your Majesties' accession to the Throne, and beg to assure Your Majesties of our loyal and grateful appreciation of Your wise and gracious interest in every public movement affecting the well-being of Your people in every part of the world.
