#### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 2ND AUGUST 1907.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or of any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved to the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and from such exhibition to any place
