

chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the rural deaneries within the archdeaconries of Coventry and Worcester, in the diocese of Worcester.

"Whereas there are within the said diocese of Worcester two archdeaconries, to wit, the said archdeaconry of Coventry and the said archdeaconry of Worcester.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester, has represented to us that it is desirable to make certain new arrangements (being the arrangements hereinafter recommended and proposed), with respect to the rural deaneries within the said archdeaconries of Coventry and Worcester.

"And whereas the areas of the said archdeaconries of Coventry and Worcester, and of the rural deaneries therein, were set forth in the schedule annexed to an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the fifth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, and published in the London Gazette on the twelfth day of the same month.

"And whereas the areas of the said archdeaconries of Coventry and Worcester have since been altered in consequence of the formation of the diocese of Birmingham and the re-arrangement of diocesan boundaries in connection with the formation of that diocese.

"And whereas we are of opinion that the new arrangements now proposed by the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Worcester, may properly be carried into effect.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Worcester (in testimony whereof he hath to this scheme set his hand and his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, a new rural deanery to be named 'The Rural Deanery of Kenilworth,' shall be constituted in the said archdeaconry of Coventry, that a new rural deanery to be named 'The Rural Deanery of Swinford' shall be constituted in the said archdeaconry of Worcester, that the rural deaneries of Rugby and Dunchurch in the said archdeaconry of Coventry shall constitute one rural deanery to be named 'The Rural Deanery of Rugby with Dunchurch,' that each of the said archdeaconries of Coventry and Worcester shall comprise and consist of those rural deaneries, the names of which are set down in order under its name, and are numbered consecutively in the schedule to this scheme annexed, and that the name which in such schedule is given to any rural deanery shall be the name thereof and that every parish or cure or church, the name of which is set down in numbered order under the name of any rural deanery in the first column of the said schedule shall belong to and be a part of the rural deanery and of the archdeaconry under the name of which it so appears as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean and Archdeacon thereof, and shall not any longer belong to or be a part of any other rural deanery or of any other archdeaconry or be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other Rural Dean or of any other Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter

or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them under or by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.
