#### TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 2nd September, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £1,500,000 in part replacement of Bills temporarily paid off on the 22nd and 29th June last.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 6th September, 1907, and will be payable at six months after date, viz.:—on the 6th March, 1908.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Consolidated Order: Appointment of Nurses.

#### ROCHDALE UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the ROCHDALE UNION:

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order, dated the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Rochdale Union (amongst others) the Poor Law Commissioners made certain regulations for the government of the Workhouse of that Union;

And whereas by Article 153 of the said Order provision was made for the appointment by the said Guardians of persons to hold certain offices in the said Workhouse, including the office of nurse, and by Articles 155 and 172 of that Order it was further directed that every such appointment should be reported to the Poor Law Commissioners, and that the Guardians should pay to the officers so appointed such salaries or

remuneration as the said Commissioners might from time to time direct or approve;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made with regard to the appointment of persons to hold the office of nurse at the said Workhouse:

Now, therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order and direct that, notwithstanding anything contained in the above-cited Order, if the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union shall submit to us for our approval a statement showing the total number of persons which the said Guardians consider it necessary to appoint to hold the office of nurse at the said Workhouse, and the salaries or scale of salaries to be assigned to those nurses, and we approve that statement, it shall not be necessary for the said Guardians to report to us each appointment under the said Order of a person to hold the office of nurse in the said Workhouse, nor to obtain our approval to the remuneration of any person so appointed, so long as the number of persons so appointed and their salaries do not exceed the number of persons and the scale of salaries shown in the said statement and approved by us:

Provided as follows:—

(1.) This Order shall not apply to the appointment of any superintendent nurse appointed subject to the provisions of the Nursing in Workhouses Order, 1897.

(2.) A person who has not reached the age of twenty-one years shall not be employed in the capacity of probationary nurse.

#### MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

County of Hertford.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

Notice is hereby given, that the County Council of Hertford have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section, putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following roads and parts of roads within the urban district of Watford, that is to say:—From the junction of Hemel Hempstead-road with Stratford-road, along Hemel Hempstead-road, High-street, and Pinner-road, to the boundary of the urban district at Watford Heath; from the junction of St. Alban's-road with Bushey Mill-lane, along St. Alban's-road and Rickmansworth-road to Cassio Bridge; from the junction of Langley-road with Stratford-road, along Langley-road, Station-road, Woodford-road, and Queen's-road, to High-street; from the boundary of the urban district in Gammon's-lane, Callow Land, along Leavesden-road, to St.
