

to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or of any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved to the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and from such exhibition to any place of destination in Great Britain situate in any scheduled area, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement.

2. In the case of movement to the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by some person authorised in that behalf by the Norfolk County Council, and in the case of movement from the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

3. The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the exhibition or place of destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere, and while being so moved shall not be subject to Regulations made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 13TH SEPTEMBER 1907).

YORKSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1907.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extent of Application of Order.

1. This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto.

Alteration of Place of Detention.

2.—(1.) Where under the Yorkshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906 (No. 2) swine have been moved from a market or saleyard specified in the Second Schedule hereto to a place of destination in the Area to which this Order applies and are required to be there detained and isolated from other swine for twenty-eight days, the swine

may with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which that place of destination is situate be moved therefrom to another place of destination, not being a market, fair, or saleyard, specified in the licence, and shall in such case be there detained and isolated for the residue of the period of twenty-eight days in accordance with the provisions of the said Order.

(2.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Article.

(3.) A copy of a licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination specified in the licence.

(4.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

Production of Licences: Names and Addresses.

3.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of September, nineteen hundred and seven.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the YORKSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1907.
