Simbirsk, Ouffa, Kazan, Nijni-Novgorod, and Stavropol, as well as the territories of Don and Dagestan will be admitted into Bulgarian territory after a medical inspection and disinfection of their property. They will also be subjected to medical surveillance for five days.

The importation into Bulgaria of caviare and of all kinds of fish, whether smoked, salted, or fresh, from the above mentioned places is forbidden.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 14TH OCTOBER 1907.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The fairs to which this Order applies are specified in the Schedule hereto.

2. Article 15 of the Sheep-Dipping (Scotland and North of England) Order of 1907 (Restrictions on Movement of Sheep out of Dipping Area and Regulation of Exposure of Sheep at Markets) shall not in the present year restrict the exposure for sale or movement of sheep which are accompanied by a declaration in the Form H set forth in the above mentioned Order with the necessary modifications signed by a police officer appointed for the purpose by the Local Authority of the District.

3. The Local Authority shall appoint one or

more persons to receive the declarations required by the above mentioned Order to accompany sheep entering therein, and such appointment shall be notified by notices affixed in or near the fair, and the declarations shall be delivered to such person, or one of such persons, upon entry of the sheep into the fair and be retained by him.

4. A police officer appointed for the purpose by the Local Authority shall in respect of any sheep exposed at the fair issue to any person claiming to be the owner of any of the sheep or his representative a declaration in the Form H set forth in the above mentioned Order with the necessary modifications.

5. This Order shall be read as one with the above mentioned Order.
