The KING has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal to grant unto Bernard John Seymour, Lord Coleridge, K.C., the Office of one of the Justices of His Majesty's High Court of Justice.

The KING has been pleased to grant unto Bryan Davies Cooke, of Park Lodge, in the parish of Kimbolton, in the county of Huntingdon, late a Captain in the Denbigh and Merioneth Militia, His Royal licence and authority that he may take and henceforth use the surname of Poole in lieu and instead of his own surname of Cooke, that he may bear the arms of Poole quarterly with those of his own family arms, and that the said surname and arms may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by his issue, the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal concession and declaration to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal licence and authority be recorded in the said College of Arms.
