

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 18TH OCTOBER 1907.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The provisions of Article 4 of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 (*Detention and Isolation after Arrival at Destination*) shall not apply in relation to the movement of swine to the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

2. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 shall not apply to the movement of swine from the said sale to any premises situate in either of the administrative counties of East and West Suffolk or in the county borough of Ipswich, if the swine are accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement granted under this Order by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Norfolk, and the following provisions are complied with:

- (i.) The swine shall be moved to the premises specified in the licence and not elsewhere and shall be there detained and isolated from other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period.
- (ii.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so

far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Article.

3.—(i.) A copy of a licence granted under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which are situate the premises specified in the licence as the place of destination.

(ii.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

4. In the case of movement of swine from the said sale to any premises situate in the administrative county of Norfolk, or the county boroughs of Norwich or Great Yarmouth, the provisions of the Norfolk (Swine-Fever) (Movement from Markets) Order of 1907 shall apply.
