By the KING. A PROCLAMATION.

EDWARD R. & I.

Whereas under the Coinage Act, 1870, it is lawful for His Majesty, with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time, by Proclamation, to direct the establishment of any branch of His Majesty's Royal Mint in England in any British possession, and to impose a charge for the coinage of gold thereat, and determine the application of such charge, and determine the extent to which such branch is to be deemed part of the said Mint, and to which coins issued therefrom are to be current and be a legal tender, and to be deemed to be issued from the said Mint:

And whereas the Government of the Dominion of Canada has applied for the establishment of a branch of the Mint at Ottawa, the capital of the Dominion, and provision has been made by the Parliament of the Dominion for an annual expenditure of seventy-five thousand dollars for the expenses of the branch Mint:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

1. A branch of Our Mint (in this Proclamation referred to as the Ottawa branch Mint) shall be established at or near Ottawa in Our Dominion of Canada on such site as the Governor-General of the Dominion in Council may approve.

2. Gold coins of the same denominations, designs, weights, and fineness as gold coins coined at Our Mint in England, may be coined at the Ottawa branch Mint, and any gold coins so coined (in this Proclamation referred to as sterling gold coins) shall be subject to the

allowance of the same remedy as gold coins coined at Our Mint in England.

3. The Master of Our Mint shall prepare and transmit such dies as may be required for the sterling gold coins to be coined at the Ottawa branch Mint.

4. The sterling gold coins coined in pursuance of this Proclamation at the Ottawa branch Mint shall be deemed to have been issued from Our Mint, and shall be current and a legal tender in like manner and to the like extent as if they had

been coined and issued in England.
5.—(i.) If any person brings to the Ottawa branch Mint any gold bullion and requires the Deputy Master of that branch to assay, coin into sterling gold coins and deliver out the same to him, the Deputy Master shall comply with the requisition upon payment for every ounce troy of gold of standard fineness of a charge of three cents where the amount brought at one time does not exceed five hundred ounces, and of two cents in any other case: Provided that—

(a) where the gold bullion so brought is such that it cannot be brought to the standard fineness of the coin to be coined thereout

(a) where the gold bullion so brought is such that it cannot be brought to the standard fineness of the coin to be coined thereout without refining the whole or some portion of it, the Deputy Master shall demand for assaying and refining the same such additional charge as the Governor-General in Council may from time to time fix, and until such charge is paid to him may refuse to receive, assay, or coin such bullion; and

(b) where the bullion brought to the branch Mint for coinage is finer than the standard fineness of the coin to be coined thereout, there shall be delivered to the person bringing the same such additional amount of coin as is proportionate to such superior fineness;

(c) no undue preference shall be shown to any person as respects the bullion brought to the branch Miut, and every person shall have priority according to the time at which he brought it;

(d) the Governor-General in Council may

make regulations for carrying into effect the provisions of this Article with respect to gold bullion, and the bringing, coining, and delivery out thereof, and in particular for regulating the time and conditions at and under which it is to be so brought, assayed, coined, and delivered out, and the minimum amount which may be so brought.

(ii.) The charges under this Article for coining, assaying, and refining shall be collected by the Deputy Master in accordance with the said regulations, either as a payment in advance, or as a deduction from the coin delivered out, or otherwise, and shall be accounted for and paid over in such manner as the Governor-General in Council directs to the Minister of Finance and Receiver-General of Canada, to be by him paid into the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Canada.

6. Subject to the provisions of this Proclamation, the Ottawa branch Mint shall be deemed

to be part of Our Mint, and accordingly

(a) the Deputy Master shall comply with all directions he may receive from the Master of Our Mint, whether as regards the returns to be made, or the transmission of specimen sterling gold coins to England or otherwise; and

(b) the said specimen sterling gold coins shall be subject to the trial of the pyx under section twelve of the Coinage Act, 1870, so, however, that they shall be examined separately from the coins coined in England or at any branch Mint other than the one regulated by this Proclamation; and

(c) the Deputy Master and other officers and persons for the purpose of carrying on the business of the branch Mint may be appointed, promoted, suspended, and removed, and their duties assigned and salaries awarded under section fifteen of the Coinage Act, 1870.

- 7. Subject to any regulations and conditions which may be made by the Master of Our Mint, the Deputy Master of the Ottawa branch Mint shall coin at that branch Mint any gold, silver, bronze, or other coin which the Governor-General of the Dominion requires to be so coined, and which is for the time being a coin of the Dominion and current and legal tender in the Dominion, but coins coined under this Article shall not for the purposes of the Coinage Act, 1870, be deemed to be coins made at, or issued from, Our Mint.
- 8. The Governor-General in Council shall cause the store of bullion and coin at the Ottawa branch Mint to be inspected half-yearly, and cause the persons inspecting the same to report thereon to the Deputy Master of the branch Mint, stating the exact amount of bullion and coin inspected by them; and copies of such report shall be transmitted by the Deputy Master to the Governor-General and to the Master of Our Mint in London.
- 9. The Master of Our Mint shall, in the execution of this Proclamation, act in accordance with any regulations made or directions given by the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury.

10. In this Proclamation-

The expression "Mint" means Our Royal

Mint in England;

The expression "Governor-General" includes the officer for the time being adminis-tering the Government of the Dominion;

The expression "Deputy Master of the branch Mint" includes any person who lawfully exercises at such branch Mint the authority of Deputy Master.

11. This Proclamation may be cited as the

Ottawa Mint Proclamation, 1907.

12. This Proclamation shall come into force on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and eight.

7 HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the first day of August, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Michael and All Angels, situate at South Beddington, within the parish of Beddington, in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Southwark.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Beddington and of the new parish of Wallington, in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several

churches of such parish and new parish.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Beddington and of the said new parish of Wallington, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Michael and All Angels, situate at South Beddington as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of Southwark, as such Bishop, with the consent of John Henry Bridges, of Ewell Court, in the county of Surrey, Esquire, as the patron of the rectory of the said parish of Beddington, and with the consents of the Reverend Hanmer William Webb-Peploe, Clerk in Holy Orders, a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, of Sir Christopher Robert Lighton, of Blackbrook, Bickley, in the county of Kent, Baronet, of the Reverend Horace Newton, Clerk in Holy Orders, a Prebendary of the

Cathedral Church of York, and of William from the said new parish of Wallington, at which Donaldson Cruddas, of Haughton Castle, in the point the said imaginary line commenced."

County of Northumberland, Esquire, one of Your And whereas the said representation has Majesty's Justices of the Peace as the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Wallington (in testimony whereof they, the said consenting parties, have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Beddington, and of the said new parish of Wallington, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Michael and All Angels, situate at South Beddington as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels, South Beddington.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels, South Beddington, comprising:

"All those contiguous portions of the parish of Beddington and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Wallington, both in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Southwark, which taken together are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the Epsom and Croydon Branch Line of the London, Brighton and South Coast Railway crosses the boundary which divides the said parish of Beddington from the said new parish of Wallington, and extending thence southward along the said boundary for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of Stafford-road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Stafford-road for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Woodcote-road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Woodcote-road, and of its continuation known as Carshalton-lane (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said new parish of Wallington from the said parish of Beddington) for a distance of fifty-four chains or thereabouts to the point where Carshalton-lane is intersected by the road leading from Little Woodcote to Sandy-lane, and extending thence in a straight line due east (thereby crossing Sandy-lane and Plough-lane) for a distance of one mile and twenty-five chains or thereabouts to a point on the eastern side of the roadway known as Merebank upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Beddington from the parish of Croydon, in the said county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Canterbury, and extending thence northward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the course of Merebank and of Merebank-lane) for a distance of one mile and twenty-one chains or thereabouts to the point where the last-mentioned boundary is crossed by the middle of the said Epsom and Croydon Branch Line of the London, Brighton and South Coast Railway, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of one mile and five chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Beddington '

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwark.

HEREAS by section two hundred and fourteen of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is amongst other things provided that a local authority hereinafter mentioned whose district includes a seaport may, with the approval of the Board of Trade, make bye-laws relating to seamen's lodging-houses in their district, and those bye-laws shall be binding upon all persons keeping houses in which seamen are lodged, and upon the owners thereof and persons employed therein, and further that such bye-laws shall amongst other things provide for the licensing, inspection, and sanitary conditions of seamen's lodging-houses, for the publication of the fact of a house being licensed for the due execution of the bye-laws for preventing the obstruction of persons engaged in securing that execution, for the preventing of persons not duly licensed holding themselves out as keeping or purporting to keep licensed houses, and for the exclusion from licensed houses of persons of improper character, and shall impose sufficient fines, not exceeding fifty pounds, for the breach of any bye-law, and that when-ever His Majesty in Council orders that in any district or any part thereof, none but persons duly licensed in pursuance of bye-laws under this section shall keep seamen's lodging-houses or let lodgings to seamen from a date therein named, a person acting in contravention of that Order shall for each offence be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds:

And whereas it is also provided by the said section that the expression "Local Authority means in the administrative county of London the County Council and elsewhere in England the Local Authority under the Public Health Acts, and the expression "district" means the area under the authority of such Local Authority:

And whereas the Council of the County Borough of Swansea is the Local Authority under the Public Health Acts and a Local Authority within the meaning of the said section:

And whereas the said Local Authority have with the approval of the Board of Trade made the bye-laws set out in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the said Act, doth order that none but persons duly licensed in pursuance of the said bye-laws shall keep seamen's lodging-houses or let lodgings to seamen from and after the date hereof, in the district of the County Borough of Swansea, or in any part thereof.

SCHEDULE referred to in the foregoing Order in Council.

- 1. In the construction of the following byelaws, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—
 - "The Council" means the Council of the County Borough of Swansea.
 - "The Borough" means the said County Borough.
 - "Seaman" means any male person other than the holder of a certificate of competency or service as master, mate, or engineer, in the merchant service who within four weeks immediately preceding the date of any transaction or occurrence within the scope of these bye-laws, has been employed in any capacity whatsoever on board a ship, whether British or foreign, but shall not include a person engaged upon a fishing boat or trawl boat.
 - "Licence" means a licence granted or which may be granted by the Council in pursuance of these bye-laws to a person authorizing him to keep the house specified therein as a seamen's lodging-house.
 - "Licensed keeper" means a person to whom a licence has been granted in pursuance of these bye-laws.
 - "Keeper" means and includes both a licensed keeper and a person who keeps a seamen's lodging-house or a house in which seamen are lodged to whom a licence has not been granted in pursuance of these bye-laws.
 - "Licensed house" means a seamen's lodginghouse in respect of which a licence has been granted in pursuance of these bye-laws.
 - "House" means and includes both a licensed house and a seamen's lodging-house or a house in which seamen are lodged in respect of which a licence has not been granted in pursuance of these bye-laws.
- 2. A person who shall apply to the Council for a licence shall furnish, on the application form to be supplied by the Council, a true statement of the particulars therein required to be specified.
- 3. The Council shall cause a register to be kept of all licences granted under these bye-laws, and the suspension or revocation of any licence shall be noted in such register.
- 4. A person who, not being entered in the Council's register as a licensed keeper, shall himself or by means of any agent or servant hold himself out as keeping or purporting to keep a licensed house, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, and to a further penalty of ten pounds for every day during which he shall continue to do so after conviction for so doing.
- 5. A licence shall not be granted in respect of a house or part of a house until it has been inspected and approved as fit for the purpose of a licensed house by the Medical Officer of Health or the Inspector of Nuisances of the Borough,

- and any person who applies for a licence shall produce to the Council evidence to its satisfaction of his fitness to be licensed.
- 6. A licensed keeper shall not transfer or lend a licence to any other person.
- 7. A licence shall be subject to such conditions specified therein, or endorsed thereon, and not being inconsistent with the laws, bye-laws, or regulations for the time being in force in the Borough, as the Council sees fit, and a licensed keeper, or any person employed in a licensed house shall not commit a breach of, or fail to observe, such conditions.
- 8. A licence shall continue in force (subject to suspension or revocation as in these bye-laws provided) for one year from first January. The Council may at its discretion refuse to renew any licence.
- 9. A house or part of a house which is in connection with any public-house or beer-house shall not be licensed as a seamen's lodging-house
- 10. A licence shall not be granted to a person who holds a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor, or who is engaged or interested in the business of a clothier, outfitter, or slop-dealer; nor shall a licence be granted in respect of any house or part of a house where intoxicating liquor is sold, nor in respect of any house or part of a house occupied or used for the purpose of the business of a clothier, outfitter, or slop-dealer; nor shall any licensed keeper sell or be engaged or interested in the sale of intoxicating liquor, nor be engaged or interested in the business of a clothier, outfitter, or slop-dealer.
- 11. A licensed keeper shall affix and keep undefaced and legible a notice with the words "Licensed Seamen's Lodging-house" in the most conspicuous place on the outside of 'the main entrance from any street to the licensed house, and also the full name and address of the licensed keeper.
- 12. A keeper and any person employed in a house shall at all times, by day or night, when required by the Medical Officer of Health or the Inspector of Nuisances of the Borough or by an officer appointed by the Council for the inspection of seamen's lodging-houses, or by an officer of the Board of Trade, or of the police, give him or them or any of them free access to all parts of such house and to the register of seamen lodgers hereinafter referred to.
- 13. A keeper shall not at any time receive, cause, or suffer to be received into a house, or permit to sleep in any room therein, any greater number of lodgers than shall be from time to time allowed by the certificate of the Medical Officer of Health or the Inspector of Nuisances of the Borough. Such certificate shall state the total number of lodgers allowed to sleep in each room of such house, as well as the total number such house may receive, and shall be supplied by the Council to the keeper; and he shall produce such certificate whenever required by any officer appointed by the Council for the inspection of seamen's lodging-houses.
- 14. A keeper shall fix and keep fixed in a conspicuous place in each room a ticket signed by the Medical Officer of Health or the Inspector of Nuisances of the Borough, stating the number of lodgers allowed to sleep in such room.
- 15. A keeper and any person employed in a house shall not at any time conceal, deface, alter, or obliterate, or permit, or suffer to be concealed, defaced, altered, or obliterated any such letter or figures.

- 16. Notwithstanding that the maximum number of lodgers to be received in a house or in any room therein may not have been fixed by the Council as hereinbefore provided, a keeper shall not cause or suffer a greater number of persons than will admit of the provision of four hundred cubic feet of free air space for each person to occupy at one time as a sleeping apartment a room which is used for that purpose.
- 17. Whenever the Council shall consider it necessary to reduce the number of lodgers to be received in any room in a house, the keeper shall, upon receiving notice in writing to that effect, under the hand of the Medical Officer of Health or the Inspector of Nuisances of the Borough, cease to permit such room to be occupied by any greater number of lodgers than that specified in such notice.
- 18. A keeper shall not at any time cause or suffer any room which may be appointed for use as a kitchen, scullery, or sitting room, or any underground room which does not comply with the provisions of the Public Health Acts, to be used as a sleeping apartment.
- 19. A keeper shall cause all such means of ventilation as may be provided in, or in connection with, any room or passage in a house, and in or in connection with any water-closet belonging to a house to be maintained at all times in good order.
- 20. A keeper shall cause the windows of every room and of the passages and water-closets in a house to be kept fully open for such time on each day as may be necessary for the purposes of ventilation, and shall cause the windows of every room which may be appointed for use and occupation as a sleeping apartment to be kept fully open from 9 A.M. to 4 P.M. in winter, and 9 A.M. to 6 P.M. in summer.

Provided that such keeper shall not be required in pursuance of this bye-law to cause any window in any room to be opened or to be kept open at any time when the state of the weather is such as to render it necessary that the window shall be closed, or when any bed in such room may be occupied by any lodger in consequence of sickness or of other sufficient cause.

- 21. A keeper shall, in the first week in the month of April, and, if required in writing by the Medical Officer of Health or the Inspector of Nuisances of the Borough, in the first week in the month of October, in every year, cause every part of a house to be cleansed, and shall, at the same time, except in such cases as are hereinafter specified, cause every area, the interior surface of every ceiling and wall of every water-closet belonging to the premises, and the interior surface of every ceiling and wall of every room, staircase, and passage in the house, to be thoroughly stopped, cleansed, and lime-washed or distempered. Provided that if any such interior surface is painted or covered with material which is such as to render the lime-washing thereof unsuitable or inexpedient, this bye-law shall be deemed to be satisfied, so long as such surface is thoroughly cleansed, and the paint or other covering thereou is renewed, if such cleansing or renewal be necessary for the purpose of keeping the house in a cleanly and wholesome condition.
- 22. A keeper shall as often as may be necessary to keep the same in a clean and wholesome state, cause all the rooms, passages, stairs, floors, windows, doors, and walls of a house to be thoroughly cleansed and freed from vermin, and shall also cause the floors of every room to be thoroughly swept daily, before the hour of ten in the forenoon, and to be well and sufficiently

- washed on Friday in each week before the hour of twelve noon.
- 23. A keeper shall cause all bed clothes and bedding and every bedstead used in a house to be thoroughly cleansed as often as shall be required for the purpose of keeping such bed clothes, bedding, and bedsteads in a clean and wholesome condition, and free from vermin.
- 24. A keeper shall cause the bed clothes of every bed in his house to be removed from such bed as soon as conveniently may be after such bed shall have been vacated by any lodger, and shall cause all such bed clothes, and the bed from which such bed clothes may have been removed, to be freely exposed to the air for one hour at least in the afternoon of every day.
- 25. A keeper shall cause every room in his house, which may be appointed for use and occupation as a sleeping apartment, to be furnished with such number of beds and bedsteads, and with such a supply of bed clothes and necessary utensils as may be sufficient for the requirements of the number of lodgers received in such room.
- 26. A keeper shall, for the use of the lodgers received into a house, cause to be provided a sufficient number of chamber utensils, and a sufficient number of washing basins or other proper receptacles for water, of adequate capacity and suitably placed, and a sufficient supply of water, and a sufficient number of towels for use in connection with such washing basins and other receptacles, and shall cause such basins or receptacles to be kept clean and in good order, and the supply of towels to be renewed as often as may be requisite.
- 27. A keeper shall cause all solid or liquid filth or refuse to be removed once at least in every day before the bour of ten in the forenoon from every room in a house, and shall once at least in every day cause every vessel, utensil, or other receptacle for such filth or refuse to be thoroughly cleansed.
- 28. In the event of any inmate of a house, whether a lodger or otherwise, being attacked by any infectious disorder, the keeper shall forthwith give intimation of the same to the Medical Officer of Health of the Borough.
- 29. A keeper, immediately after being informed or having ascertained that any inmate of a house, whether a lodger or otherwise, is ill of any infectious disease, shall adopt all such precautions as may be necessary to prevent the spread of such infectious disease. Such keeper shall not, at any time while such inmate is suffering from such infectious disease, cause or allow any other person, except a person voluntarily in attendance and authorized to attend on such inmate, to use or occupy the same room as such inmate.
 - (a) Where in pursuance of the statutory provision in that behalf, the sanitary authority may order the removal of such inmate to a hospital or other place for the reception of the sick, such keeper, on being informed of such order, shall forthwith take all such steps as may be requisite on his part to secure the safe and prompt removal of such inmate in compliance with the order of the sanitary authority, and shall, in and about such removal, adopt all such precautions as, in accordance with any instructious which he may receive from the Medical Officer of Health of the Borough, may be most suitable for the circumstances of the case.

- (b) Where, in consequence of the illness of such inmate, there may be reasonable grounds for apprehending the spread of infection through the admission of a lodger to any room or rooms in a house or through the admission to such room or rooms of the maximum number of lodgers authorized to be received therein, such keeper, after being furnished with the necessary instructions from the Medical Officer of Health of the Borough, and until the grounds for apprehending the spread of infection shall have been removed, shall cease to receive any lodger into such room or rooms or shall receive therein such number of lodgers, being less than the maximum number, as the exigencies of the case may require.
- (c) Such keeper shall, immediately after the death, removal, or recovery of an inmate who may have been ill of any infectious disease, give written notice thereof to the Medical Officer of Health of the Borough.
- (d) When a registered medical practitioner has certified that any inmate of a house is suffering from any dangerous infectious disorder, and can be safely removed to hospital, such inmate shall not obstruct the sanitary authority in effecting his removal to any hospital or infirmary with the consent of the authorities thereof.
- (e) When the Medical Officer of Health of the Borough certifies that the cleansing and disinfecting of any house or part thereof, or of any articles therein likely to retain infection, or the destruction of such articles would tend to prevent or check any dangerous infectious disease, such keeper shall give the sanitary authority such facilities as may be necessary to enable such authority to carry out such works of cleansing, disinfection, or destruction as such Medical Officer of Health may deem to be necessary.
- (f) Unless and until by such cleansing and disinfection the necessary precautions for preventing the spread of disease shall have been duly taken, such keeper shall not cause or suffer any other lodger to be received into the room or rooms which, in the case hereinbefore specified, may have been exposed to infection.
- 30. A keeper shall provide, in a suitable and convenient situation for the use of lodgers, properly constructed water-closets in the proportion of one such water-closet for every twelve lodgers; and shall cause such water-closets and every part of the apparatus of such water-closets to be kept clean, and shall cause the same and every drain or means of drainage with which they or either of them may communicate, to be maintained in good order and efficient condition.
- 31. A keeper shall cause every part of the structure of a house to be maintained at all times in good order.
- 32. A keeper shall cause the yard, area, forecourt, or other open space within the curtilage of a house to be maintained at all times in good order and thoroughly clean, and free from any accumulation of filth or other refuse.
- 33. A keeper and every person employed in a house shall not receive any female lodger into such house.
- 34. A licensed keeper and every person employed in a licensed house shall not knowingly lodge, or knowingly harbour, any thief or reputed thief, any prostitute or reputed prostitute, or any other person of improper character.

- 35. A keeper shall keep a register and shall enter therein the name, age, and nationality of every seaman lodger received into a house, the name of the last vessel from which such seaman lodger was discharged, and the port of discharge, with the name and port of registry of any vessel he may join while resident in such house, and his declared destination on leaving.
- 36. A keeper shall put up or affix and keep up or affixed a copy of these bye-laws in a suitable and conspicuous position in the common sitting-room of a house in such a manner that the contents of such copy may be clearly and distinctly visible and legible, and shall enter upon the space left for the purpose at the foot of that copy, a scale of the charge per day for board, lodging, and necessaries made in such house, and shall not make a higher charge than is provided by the scale on any pretence whatever.
- 37. Upon the Council being satisfied that any licensed keeper has been guilty of a breach of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, or the Acts amending the same, or that such keeper has kept, or is keeping, or is allowing to be kept, a house in which drunkenness, gambling, or immoral or fraudulent practices prevail, or is or has been a party to such proceedings, or neglects to remove from such house any person of improper or immoral character who may have entered therein, or has failed, or is failing to comply with these bye-laws or any of them, the Council may suspend or revoke all licences granted to such keeper.
- 38. No person shall obstruct any officer or person engaged in securing the execution of these bye-laws.
- 39. Every person offending against any of the foregoing bye-laws, except where otherwise expressly provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for every such offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for every day during which the offence may be continued after conviction for the first offence.
- 40. These bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seven.

- (2) Goods coming directly from the above places into Bulgaria will be admitted only by Varna and Bourgas, and after having been submitted to special quarantine measures in force.
- (3) The Port of Varna on the Black Sea, and that of Silistria on the Danube, remain open only for travelling workmen gardeners coming from Russia. Travellers arriving in groups of more than 250 persons at Varna, and more than 100 at Silistria, will be admitted into Bulgarian Territory only after a quarantine of five days, and a disinfection of their effects.
- (4) The importation into Bulgaria of caviare and of all kinds of fresh, salted, or smoked fish, and of known products of animals coming from infected places is forbidden.
 - (5) The quarantine measures ordered by the

Decrees of August 2 and September 17 [published in the London Gazette of September 3 and October 15] are repealed.

1. The importation of the following articles is prohibited:—

(a.) Coffee beans, or ground coffee, coloured with substances injurious to health.

(b.) Rags.

(c.) Susceptible goods which are not capable of being disinfected arriving on board infected vessels, or vessels from infected places.

(d.) Hides and bones from any infected ports or vessels or from any place in which cattle disease exists.

(e.) Vines and fruit packed in vine leaves.

Note.—The importation of cuttings or shoots of the American or other vine is prohibited, unless the goods are accompanied by an antiphylloxeric certificate, in accordance with the Berne International Conference of 1881, signed before a British Consular Authority, or unless the goods be subjected to examination and disinfection by the Inspector of Agriculture.

(f.) Hoofs and hair of animals, raw silk, wool, human hair and skins raw, fresh, or untanned, arriving from infected ports.

(g.) Cotton seed, unless accompanied by a certificate from the British Consular Authority, or, where there is no such authority, from the local Government Authority, to the effect that anthrax is not prevalent in the district in which such cotton seed was grown.

2. The importation of plants, roots or garden soil from any port in the Mediterranean is prohibited, unless the goods be accompanied by an antiphylloxeric certificate signed by the proper

authority.

3. The importation of the following articles from any place which has been declared infected, or from which the Head of the Government considers that such articles should not be imported without disinfection, or from an infected vessel, is allowed, after disinfection.

(a.) Wearing apparel, soiled linen, articles of

bedding and feathers.

(b.) Used sacks, carpets, and embroideries.(c.) Susceptible goods which are capable of

being disinfected.

4. Cereals imported in infected ships shall be kept for 21 days at the Lazaretto or other place to be appointed by the Superintendent of Public Health, and shall be aired under the direction of the Quarantine Authorities.

5. Infected vessels are vessels which have, or have had, on board, during the voyage or the preceding 10 days, cases of cholera, yellow fever, plague, or any disease with symptoms which, in the opinion of the Superintendent of Public Health, resemble the symptoms of the said diseases.

6. For the purposes of this notice, the words "infected places" mean any countries or ports which are, by Government Notice published in the Government Gazette, declared to be infected.

3. Except by the direction of the conductor, no person shall enter or depart from a carriage by the driver's platform or by any platform except by the near or left-hand side of the carriage. All persons desiring to mount a car for the purpose of travelling thereon shall first permit all persons to alight who may be intending to do so.

4. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette inside any carriage. Any person offending against this Bye-law shall be liable in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter mentioned, to be summarily removed from the carriage.

5. No person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical

instrument.

6. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or mount upon any carriage, and any such person who shall be found in or upon any carriage may be immediately removed from such carriage by or under the direction of the conductor.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language, or behave offensively whilst in or upon any carriage, waiting room or other premises used in connection with the tramways, or spit or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any such carriage, waiting room or premises, or wilfully interfere with the com-

fort of any passenger.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface apy number plate, printed or other notice in or upon any carriage, or place his feet upon or lie upon any seat, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations in addition to the liability to pay the amount of

any damage done.

9. No person whose clothing or personal condition might in the opinion of the conductor soil or injure any carriage, or the linings or cushions thereof, or the clothing of any passenger, or who in the opinion of the conductor might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any carriage, and any such person may be prevented from entering in or upon any carriage, and shall not enter in or upon any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in or upon any carriage shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the carriage, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned. Any person offending against this Bye-law, shall be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty below mentioned, to be summarily removed from the carriage. Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon a car under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

10. No person suffering from any contagious or infectious d sease shall enter or mount upon any carriage, nor shall any clothing, bedding, or other articles likely to spread any contagious or infectious disease be placed by any person upon any carriage.

11. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor the fare legally demandable for

the journey.

12. Each passenger shall retain the ticket (if any) delivered to him on payment of his fare until the end of his journey or until the same shall be delivered up by him on demand as hereinafter provided, and shall show the same when required so to do to the conductor, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket to the conductor or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

13. Any ticket issued by the Company in respect of a fare shall be available only for the

carriage on or for which it is issued, and no passenger shall be entitled to leave any carriage for any purpose whatever at any stage and resume his journey by such carriage or by a different carriage from that on or for which such ticket was issued except upon payment of a fresh fare from the point at which the passenger re-entered such carriage or entered the second or other

carriage.

14. No passenger not being a person belonging to the labouring class within the true intent and meaning of the Company's Acts of Parliament or Orders shall use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for persons belonging to the

labouring class.

15. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of persons belonging to the labouring class) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the driver's platform and

not in or upon any part of any carriage.

16. No person other than an officer or servant of the Company shall travel on the steps or platform of any carriage or stand on the roof thereof, or sit on the outside rail on the roof thereof, and any person so travelling, standing, or sitting shall immediately on the request of the conductor cease so to do.

17. No person, other than a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter into or mount upon any carriage or shall hold or hang on by or

to or be upon any part of any carriage.
18. Whenever and so long as the interior of any car used upon the tramways of the Company is occupied by the full number of passengers for whom accommodation is stated in the notice attached to or painted on such car to be provided in such interior, no additional person (other than the conductor of such car or any other duly authorized officer or servant of the Company) shall enter or remain or be in such interior.

19. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

20. No person shall sell or offer for sale any goods or merchandise of any sort, or distribute any advertisements, pamphlets, or any other

literature in or upon any carriage.

21. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any carriage, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other unimal might be offensive or an annoyance to the passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or upon any carriage in breach of this Regulation, shall be removed by the person in charge thereof from the carriage, immediately upon the request of the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, such dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

22. No person with loaded firearms or gunpowder, or other explosive materials, shall travel

in or upon any carriage.
23. No unauthorised person shall interfere in any way with the electrical equipment or other mechanical apparatus of any carriage. person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done to such electrical equipment or other mechanical apparatus.

24. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Company.

25. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

26. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regu-
