ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 26TH NOVEMBER 1907.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Authorised Exhibition and Sale of Fat Swine.

1. The provisions of the Somersetshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1907 (No. 2) shall not apply to the exhibition and sale of fat swine referred to in the Schedule hereto or to the movement of swine therefrom except that Article 12 (*Offences*) shall be incorporated in this Order and be read as if this Order were the Order therein referred to.

Regulation of Movement of Swine from Exhibition.

2.—(1.) Swine exposed at the said exhibition shall not be moved therefrom unless accompanied by a Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Somerset or elsewhere than to a bacon factory or slaughter-house specified in the Licence.

(2.) The swine shall before being moved from the exhibition be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting, with an indelible composition of red colour, of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(3.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue

(4.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay,

and shall during the movement, as far as is practicable, be kept separate from all other swine not being moved under this Order.

(5.) The Licence under this Order for the movement of swine from the exhibition shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

(6.) The swine shall be detained at the bacon factory or slaughter-house until they are slaughtered.

(7.) A copy of every Licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District wherein the place of destination of the swine is situate.

General Provisions as to Movement.

3. Swine moved with a Licence under this Order shall not be subject to any restriction on movement of swine imposed by Order of the Board or by any regulation of a Local Authority made under any such Order.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Interpretation.

6. In this Order—
“Bacon factory” means premises in which the business of a curer of bacon is carried on;
“Slaughter-house” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered.
