The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Quarantine Notice, issued by the Swedish Board of Trade, declaring the towns of Bona and Philippeville in Algeria infected with plague:—

NOTICE.

In compliance with the Royal Order in Council of June 16th, 1905, the Board of Trade, upon official reports, hereby declare the towns of Bona and Philippeville in Algeria infected with plague.

In accordance with the notices issued the following places are considered as infected:—

With plague:

The Russian Government Astrachan; the towns of Bona and Philippeville in Algeria; Egypt; San Francisco in California; Rio de Janeiro in Brazil; Peru; Antofagasta and Pisagua in Chile; the Provinces of Hedschas and Yemen in Arabia; the Ural and Transcaspien districts in Asia; Afghanistan; the Ports of Schatel-Arab; British East India; Rangoon in British Burma; Manila on Luzon; the Island of Formosa; Hanoi in Tonkin; the Port of Newchwang in China; Japan; Madagascar; Sydney, Perth, Fremantle and Geraldton in Australia; and

With cholera:

The Russian Governments Jaroslav, Vladimir, Kostroma, Saratow, Kasan, Kiew, Nichui-Novgorod, Simbirsk, Pensa, Samara, Vjatka, Perm, Astrachan, Ekaterinoslav, Bessarabia, Kherson, Volhynia, Tchernigov, Poltava, Kharkov, Kursk and Orenburg, the district Don Cossacks and the town of Baku in Russia; the Akmolinsk and Semipolatsinsk districts in Asia; the governments Tomsk, Tobolsk and Irkutsk as also the Transbaikal district in Siberia; the Ports of the Red Sea; the Ports of British East India; Cochinchina; Tonkin; China; Japan and Morocco.

The station of observation and quarantine is until further notice, located at Kånsö, near Gothenburg. Stockholm, the 18th of November, 1907.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Removing Suspension of Articles of General Order: Medical Officers' Fees:—

SAINT AUSTELL UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Saint Austell Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by an Order dated the second day of May, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-

three, the Poor Law Board suspended, so far as regards the Saint Austell Union, the operation of Articles 177, 181, and 183 of the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, dated the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven.

And whereas by the said Articles of the last above-mentioned Order, provision was made for the payment of special fees to Medical Officers in certain cases, and it is expedient that the suspension of those Articles should be removed.

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, do by this Our Order remove the suspension aforesaid in relation to the said Union of Articles 177, 181, and 183 of the said General Order dated the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF EAST SUSSEX.

Parish of Handcross.

To the County Council of East Sussex;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the Local Authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of East Sussex having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned sub-section putting the provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising part of a certain road situate at Handcross, in the county of East Sussex, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising that portion of the main road from London to Brighton which passes through the village of Handcross and lies between the milestones indicating thirty-three and thirty-four miles from London.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and seven.
